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Preface

This study was prepared for the Colorado Tourism Board and the Colorado Travel and Tourism Authority to document the economic significance of the visitor industry on Colorado's economy. It is part of a larger research project on travel and tourism in Colorado conducted by Longwoods International.

Dean Runyan Associates was subcontracted by Longwoods specifically to provide economic impact estimates. These impact estimates were derived from the Regional Travel Impact Model (RTIM) developed by Dean Runyan Associates and provide measurement of the visitor expenditures in Colorado and the employment, payroll, income and tax revenue directly generated from these expenditures. This analysis provides estimates of the economic impact of travel in the State of Colorado and each of its 63 counties during 1997.

Introduction

The travel industry is one of the most important segments of the Colorado economy, providing business opportunities, employment and government revenue throughout the state. Travel originating in domestic and international markets has large economic impacts for the state and its local jurisdictions. Further, many locations within Colorado serve as travel destinations in their own right, for both Colorado residents and out-of-state visitors. These areas accordingly consider travel and tourism a primary industry.

Objectives

This report describes the economic impacts of travel to and through the State of Colorado and each of its 63 counties during 1997. In addition, the county impact estimates have been combined into four regional groupings and eleven districts to facilitate an analysis of the significance of the travel industry in different geographic areas of the state.

Travel impacts consist of estimates of travel spending and the employment, wage and salary income (payroll), and state and local tax revenues generated by this spending. These estimates are also broken out by type of traveler accommodation and by the type of business in which the expenditures occur.

Impact Measurement Methodology

Travel impacts are measured using the Regional Travel Impact Model (RTIM). This model uses survey data on visitor expenditures and various other sources of information including room tax receipts, camping attendance data, and payroll and employment data. A review of the model's methodological procedures is included in Appendix A. Appendix B contains a glossary of terms as they apply to this report and the travel industry specifically.

Economic impact measurements reported herein represent only direct economic impacts, which are those that occur directly as a result of travel and the associated expenditures within Colorado. Indirect or "multiplier" effects are not included.

The "travel industry" as described in this report refers to a collection of businesses that provide goods and services to the traveling public. These types of businesses are coded according to the U.S. Office of Management and Budget's Standard Industrial Classifications (SIC). Appendix C shows the level of detail at which traveler expenditures are attributed to business categories, as well as the specific assignments to SIC codes.

Types of Travel Impacts Included

This analysis includes all overnight travel in Colorado. All trips to Colorado by U.S. residents and foreign visitors are included. The travel of Colorado residents to other destinations in Colorado is included provided that it involves an overnight stay away from home and does not constitute commuting nor other routine travel. Travel to non-Colorado destinations by Colorado residents is not included.

The terms "traveler" and "visitor" are used interchangeably in this report. Both represent a person who is traveling in Colorado away from his or her home, on a trip as defined above. The purpose of such travel can be for business, pleasure, shopping, to attend meetings, or for personal, medical or educational purposes.

Impact Categories

The specific categories of travel impacts included in this analysis are as follows:

	Description
Impact Category	
Expenditures or	Purchases by travelers during their trip, including lodging taxes and other applicable local and state taxes paid by the traveler at the point
Travel Spending	of sale.
Payroll	Payments to wage and salary workers by the businesses which receive travel expenditures. Only the payroll attributable to travel expenditures is included; this typically is only a portion of all business receipts.
Employment	Employment associated with the above payroll; this includes both full- and part-time positions. Employment of working proprietors is not included.
Local Tax Receipts	Tax receipts collected by counties and municipalities, as levied on applicable travel-related purchases. Consists of transient occupancy taxes and local sales and use taxes.
State Tax Receipts	State corporate income taxes and gasoline taxes attributable to travel expenditures, personal income taxes based on the associated travel-generated employment, and tax receipts derived from state sales taxes on travel-related purchases.

It should be noted that existing data sources do not permit the calculation of proprietor income (as opposed to employee wages and salaries). This may result in some underestimation of payroll and tax receipts, particularly in rural areas where small business ownership is relatively more important.

Visitor Categories

Travelers are classified according to the type of accommodation in which they stay. The types of visitors are as follows:

Type of Visitor	Description
Hotel/Motel/Resort	Travelers staying in hotels, motels, resorts, bed & breakfast establishments, rented condominiums and other commercial accommodations (excluding campgrounds) where sales taxes and/or a transient occupancy tax are collected.
Private Camper	Travelers staying in a privately owned (i.e., commercial) campground.
Public Camper	Travelers staying in a publicly managed campground such as those managed by the Colorado State Parks Department, the U.S. Forest Service or the National Park Service.
Private Home Visitor	Travelers staying as guests with friends or relatives.
Vacation Home Visitor	Travelers using their own vacation home or timeshare and those borrowing or renting a vacation home where transient occupancy tax is not collected.
Pass Through	Travelers in the Denver Metro or Pikes Peak region that stay overnight in another region of Colorado. Pass Throughs were not estimated for other regions of Colorado.

Travel spending is also distinguished by the type of product or service visitors spend their money on. These business spending categories are:

Type of Business	Description
Accommodations	Commercial accommodations and public campgrounds, including time share units that collect fees. Private home visitors do not have accommodation expenditures.
Eating, drinking	Food and beverages in restaurants and clubs.
Ground transport	Gasoline and motor vehicle services, auto rentals, taxis, buses and other local ground transportation.
Recreation	Any event or activity classified as entertainment or recreation.
Retail Sales	Other retail goods, including food and beverages for off-premise consumption.
Air Transportation	Air transportation for travel within the state of Colorado.

Air Transportation

It should be noted that Air Transportation estimates refer only to air transportation for travel within the state of Colorado. Impacts for air travel to and from Colorado are excluded. Unless otherwise noted, air transportation spending is excluded from the spending by accommodation categories indicated in the visitor categories. Total spending by accommodation is referred to as destination spending.

The State

The travel industry is a major component of the Colorado economy. In many localities, it is one of the largest and most rapidly growing segments of the economy. The industry is comprised primarily of business firms and organizations that provide services and sell retail goods, such as lodging establishments, restaurants, recreational facilities and transportation services. The money that visitors spend on these goods and services while in Colorado creates employment for residents of the state. Travel spending also generates tax receipts for local and state governments, consisting primarily of sales and use taxes levied on the purchase of goods and services by the traveler. The state government also collects taxes on motor fuel, the personal income of employees, and the corporate income of businesses.

Visitors spent more than \$7.1 billion in Colorado in 1997. Spending on overnight travel directly supported 112,000 jobs with a payroll of more than \$1.5 billion, and generated \$390 million in local and state tax revenues.



Travel Impacts by Type of Traveler Accommodation

Destination spending refers to the money spent by travelers for goods and services in a particular locality (i.e. county) within the state. Destination spending excludes air fares and commissions paid to travel agents. The graph *Travel Spending by Type of Accommodation* breaks out this spending according to the type of overnight accommodation the traveler used.

Those that stayed in hotels, motels and resorts (including rented condominiums and bed & breakfasts) spent more that \$4.8 billion or 70% of all destination spending in the state. Those that stayed in the private home of a friend or relative spent \$1.2 billion or 17% of all destination spending. The high proportion for hotels, motels, and resorts is a reflection of business travel to the Denver Metro and Pikes Peak regions and the importance of skiing and other recreational activities in mountain resort areas of the state. Although campgrounds and vacation homes (an owned second home or time-share unit) comprise a relatively small proportion of destination spending within the state, in many counties these types of accommodations are significant.



Travel Impacts by Type of Business

Colorado's travel industry is composed primarily of retail and service firms representing an assortment of businesses. The following graph, *Travel Spending by Type of Business*, shows the types of businesses in which visitors make their purchases.

More than 27% (\$1,880 million) of all travel spending was for overnight accommodations, which includes hotels, motels, resorts, campgrounds, and vacation homes. Visitors spent almost as much (\$1,800 million) on eating and drinking in restaurants and clubs. The high proportion of spending on these two categories also is a reflection of the importance of business travel and leisure travel to Colorado's recreational destinations.

Spending on ground transportation (\$1,020 million) includes gasoline and services for private motor vehicles, auto rentals, and fares. Spending on recreation (\$920 million) includes spending on a wide variety of recreational outdoor activities and cultural events. In Colorado, skiing is the largest single component of recreational spending (about 1/3 statewide). Retail sales (\$820 million) include shopping in a variety of retail establishments (excluding groceries and beverages). Shopping is generally a larger component of travel spending in urban areas. Spending in food stores (\$420 million) is more important in rural areas.



Employment and Payroll

Visitor spending by overnight travelers in Colorado directly generated 112,000 jobs in the travel industry with a payroll of more than \$1.5 billion. Eating and drinking establishments employed the most (47,000), followed by accommodations (32,000) and recreational facilities (18,000). The large number of travel generated jobs in these businesses is a reflection of both the amount of spending and the labor intensity of these types of businesses. Expenditures on retail goods and ground transportation generate relatively fewer jobs because the cost of the good (e.g., gasoline) is high relative to the payroll.

Travel Generaled Employment




Tax Revenues Generated by Travel Spending

Visitor spending directly generated \$390 million in local and state tax revenues. The local tax receipts of \$220 million represent county and jurisdictional sales taxes, transient occupancy (or room) taxes, and auto rental taxes related to travel spending. The state tax receipts of \$170 million represent the state sales tax, motor fuel tax, and taxes on personal and corporate income receipts related to travel spending. The estimates of tax revenue do not include property tax payments made by travel industry business.

Regions

The following section provides estimates of travel impacts for four regions within Colorado. These four regions are the Denver Metro region, the Mountain Resort counties west of the Rockies, the Pikes Peak region, and all remaining counties in the State. This regional breakout of travel impacts indicates that while travel spending is significant throughout the state, (see *Travel Spending by Region*, below) the nature of the travel industry varies throughout the state.




Destination Spending by Type of Accommodatis








Destination Spending by Type of Accommodatic








Destination Spending by Type of Accommodatic








Destination Spending by Type of Accommodatic









Appendix A

Regional Travel Impact Model (RTIM)

Travel Impact Estimation Procedures

Travel Spending

Hotel, Motel, Resort. Spending on commercial accommodations by guests staying in hotels, motels, resorts, bed & breakfasts, and rented condominiums is estimated from Transient Occupancy Tax collections at the city or county jurisdictional level. Where there is no Transient Occupancy Tax, accommodation spending is estimated from sales tax receipts on lodging. These county level estimates are consistent with those derived from other sources, including survey data collected by Longwoods for the state and regions. Spending by hotel, motel, and resort guests in other business categories, such as food and transportation, is estimated using spending distributions reported in the visitor survey data. The spending distribution shows how travelers divide their spending between lodging and other purchases.

Private Campground. Spending by campers using commercial campgrounds is estimated from the number of commercial campsites, the average occupancy of these campsites, and the average daily expenditures of visitor camp parties reported in survey data. Spending in other business categories is estimated in the same way as for hotel guests.

Public Campground. Spending by campers using public campgrounds is estimated from visitor counts at national and state parks, national forests, and state and federally managed recreation areas. Visitation is then multiplied by daily spending estimates from the visitor survey.

Private Home. Spending by private home guests is determined from visitor survey data estimating the number of visitors staying as guests of friends and relatives and applying these rates to the household population base in individual counties.

Vacation Home. Estimated spending by vacation home renters and owners is based on a ratio derived between the number of visitors staying in commercial accommodations and those staying in vacation homes, and the relative expenditure levels for each type of visitor. This information, derived from visitor survey data, is applied to total hotel guest spending to estimate total vacation home spending in the state. This total is distributed among counties using housing data from the U.S. Bureau of the Census.

Pass Through. The share of Pass Through visitation as a percentage of total travel is estimated from visitor survey data and applied to estimates of average daily spending by pass through travelers for the Denver Metro and Pikes Peak regions.

Note: All visitor survey data referenced in this study was provided by Longwoods International.

Appendix A

Travel Impact Estimation Procedures

Air Transportation. Expenditures on air travel within Colorado are estimated from survey data and applied to employment and payroll data provided by the Colorado Department of Labor and Employment.

Related Travel Impacts

Spending by travelers generates jobs, payroll, and state and local tax revenue.

Payroll generated directly from traveler expenditures is estimated from the payroll-to-receipts ratio obtained from data published in the Colorado *Census of Service Industries* and *Census of Retail Trade* publications for each business category.

Employment in each business category is calculated from wage data supplied by the Colorado Department of Labor and Employment.

Local Taxes consist of transient occupancy taxes applied to hotels, motels and resorts and to local sales and use taxes applicable to traveler purchases of goods and services.

State Taxes consist of state sales taxes applied to traveler spending; state fuel tax levied on motor fuel purchases for travel; and personal and corporate income taxes.

Personal income tax revenues are estimated by applying the average state personal income tax rate to payrolls resulting from traveler spending. Corporate income tax revenues are estimated by calculating an implicit corporate income tax rate.

Appendix B

Definition of Terms

Accommodation: Spending for lodging by hotel and motel guests, campers and vacation home users.

Air Transportation: Air passenger spending attributable to travelers in Colorado. The spending total includes only spending on air transportation within the state.

Campers: Travelers staying at RV parks and commercial campgrounds or at public campgrounds such as those of the National Park Service or U.S. Forest Service.

Destination Spending: Spending by travelers at or near their destinations. This excludes spending on Air Transportation and for Travel Arrangement. All automobile operating expenses are included in the Ground Transportation component of Destination Spending.

Eating, Drinking: Businesses serving food and beverages for immediate consumption. In addition to table service restaurants, this category includes fast-food outlets and refreshment stands.

Employment: Industry employment (jobs) associated with the travel-generated payroll; this includes both full- and part-time positions. However, employment of working proprietors is not included.

Expenditures: Purchases by travelers during their trip, including lodging taxes and other applicable local and state taxes paid by the traveler at the point of sale.

Ground Transport: Spending on car rentals, gasoline and other vehicle operating expenses and on local transportation such as taxi, bus and train.

Hotel, Motel, Resort Guests: Travelers staying in hotels, motels, resorts, bed & breakfast establishments, rented condominiums and other lodging places where the Transient occupancy tax or a sales tax is collected.

Local Tax Receipts: Tax revenue collected by counties and municipalities, as levied on applicable travel-related businesses. Includes the transient occupancy taxes and local sales taxes.

Pass Through: Overnight travelers in Colorado who pass-through one region of the state and stay overnight in another. Pass Through travel is estimated only for the Denver Metro and Pikes Peak region in this report.

Appendix B

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Payroll: Wages and salaries paid to workers by the businesses that receive travel expenditures. Only the payroll attributable to travel expenditures is included. Does not include proprietors' income.

Private Home Guests: Travelers staying as guests with friends or relatives.

Receipts: Travel expenditures less the sales and excise taxes imposed on those expenditures. Also referred to as business receipts.

Recreation: Spending on amusement and recreation, such as admissions to tourist attractions.

Retail Sales: Spending for gifts, souvenirs, and other items, including food and beverages purchased for off-premise consumption. Includes purchas of liquor, beer and wine.

Spending Distributions: Information from visitor surveys showing how spending by each type of visitor is divided among various business categories.

State Tax Receipts: State sales taxes, corporate income taxes and motor fuel taxes attributable to travel expenditures and personal income taxes based on the associated travel-generated employment.

Transient Occupancy Tax: A local tax charged on lodging. Also referred to as Room Tax, Transient Lodging Tax, Hotel Tax or Bed Tax.

Travel: An overnight trip that is not of a local or commuting nature. Travel may be for business or pleasure purposes.

Traveler: A person traveling in Colorado. A traveler may be a Colorado resident or a resident of another state. The terms traveler and visitor have the same meaning in this report.

Vacation Home User: Travelers using their own vacation home or timeshare and those renting a vacation home or privately-owned cabin where transient occupancy tax is not collected.
