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## Executive Summary

This report is submitted to the Colorado General Assembly in compliance with Section 26-11-205.5, (4) (a) and (b) C.R.S., as amended (as adopted under House Bill-02-1209, Older Coloradans Program). The General Assembly requested a report be provided on the detailed use of moneys appropriated via the Older Coloradans cash fund.

Legislative language requiring the submission of this report states:

- a. On or before August 1, 2002 and each August 1 thereafter, each Area Agency on Aging shall submit a report to the state office detailing the use of moneys from the program for the previous fiscal year, including an itemization of how many more persons received each service because of such moneys.
- b. On or before November 1, 2002 and each November 1 thereafter, the state office shall compile the reports from the Area Agencies on Aging (AAA) and submit a report for the previous fiscal year to the Joint Budget Committee of the General Assembly, the Health, Environment, Children and Families Committee of the Senate, and Health, Environment, Welfare, and Institutions Committee of the House of Representatives detailing the use of moneys from the program.

The following charts, derived from the SAMS (Social Asset Management System) database and information provided by the AAAs contain summary data from the charts presented on pages 5-8 covering the period of July 1, 2003 through June 30, 2004. The summary of services found below is located in Chart Two, page 6.

Funding provided by HB 02-1209 allowed 9,333 senior citizens to receive registered services<sup>1</sup> and an additional 23,747 to receive non-registered services, both of which enabled them to remain in their homes and communities. In addition, the grant funds used for the administration grant plan were below the statutory maximum of ten percent.

**BACKGROUND: Statutory and Legislative History of Older Coloradans Program, State Funding for Senior Services**

The Older Coloradans Program was created to allocate funds to Area Agencies on Aging for the provision of community-based services to persons sixty years of age or older to assist such persons to live in their own homes and communities for as long as possible. Such services include, but are not limited to, congregate nutrition, home-delivered meals, transportation services, in-home services, ombudsman services, legal services, elder abuse prevention, outreach, and information and referral services.

Over the next decade, the number of Colorado citizens, 60 years and older, will increase from 633,698 in 2005 to 955,744 in 2015. This represents a fifty-one percent increase. This substantial increase in the older population is the result of several factors including expanded longevity.

The moneys appropriated for the program must be distributed to Area Agencies on Aging using the same formula<sup>2</sup> that the Department uses to distribute moneys available under Title III of the Older Americans Act of 1965, as amended, (Parts B-Supportive Services; C-Nutrition Services, D-Preventive Health Services, and E-Caregiver Support Services).

The Older Coloradans Program is funded through an older Coloradans cash fund, consisting of moneys transferred from sales and use taxes under the authority of Section 39-26-123(2)(a)(I)(A.6), C.R.S. The fund is subject to annual appropriation by the General Assembly. Interest derived from the deposit and investment of this fund is credited to the fund. Any amount remaining in the fund at the end of any fiscal year shall remain in the fund and shall not be transferred or credited to the General Fund or any other fund. The State Treasurer is authorized to credit the fund any public or private gifts, grants, or donations received by the state department for implementation of the program.

<sup>1</sup> Registered services include personal care, homemaker, chore, congregate meals, case management, and screening. Clients who utilize these services are assessed and enrolled into the SAMS 2000 database. Demographic information and client use of services are tracked within the database. Non-registered services are those such as Information and Assistance and group education. These services are reported in the aggregate.

<sup>2</sup> Colorado uses an intrastate funding formula to distribute Older Americans Act federal and state matching general funds to Area Agencies on Aging. Such allocation is based on the number of persons:

60 years and over	(weighted 40%),
60 years and over low income	(weighted 15%),
60 years and over minority	(weighted 15%),
60 years and over rural	(weighted 15%),
<u>75 years and over</u>	<u>(weighted 15%).</u>
Total	weighted 100%

## Itemization of Number of Persons Served and Detail of Moneys Spent

The following chart, derived from the SAMS database represents the number of additional unduplicated clients served with H.B. 02-1209 funds. Client information is collected for registered client services only. These services include personal care, homemaker, chore, congregate meals, home delivered meals, case management and screening. Therefore, the numbers below represent unduplicated clients in addition to the above-mentioned array of services. Other services, for example transportation, only collect units and clients in the aggregate form. For this reason, it is not possible to determine an unduplicated client count over all services provided by H.B. 02-1209. Chart One, below, offers the total of unduplicated clients served. The client count on Chart Two, page 6, offers an aggregate (duplicate) count of clients served.

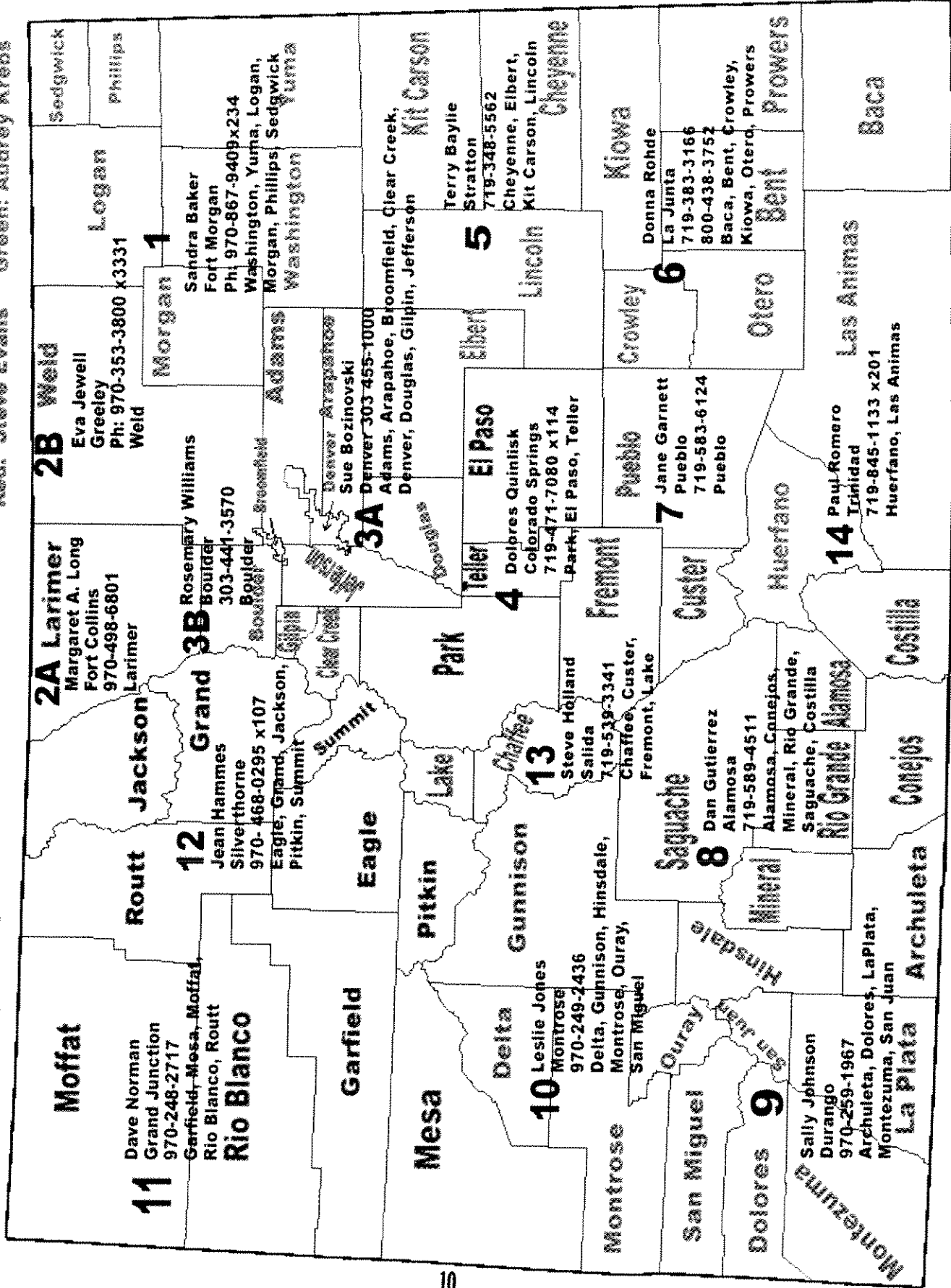
