**RE:** 2003 Executive Summary on Performance Audits of Tobacco Settlement Programs

The purpose of this memo is to report on evaluations of tobacco settlement programs conducted by the Office of the State Auditor (OSA) during 2003. Section 2-3-113, C.R.S., requires the Office of the State Auditor to conduct or cause to be conducted program reviews and performance evaluations of each state program receiving funding from the tobacco settlement agreement. These reviews are to assess whether the tobacco settlement program meets its stated goals efficiently and effectively. Pursuant to this statute, the OSA is also to submit an annual executive summary of the program reviews to the Legislative Audit Committee, the Governor, the Attorney General, the Joint Budget Committee, the House and the Senate Health, Environment, Welfare, and Institutions Committees, and various state agencies.

During 2003 the OSA conducted evaluations of two tobacco settlement programs (the Veterans Trust Fund and the Comprehensive Primary and Preventative Care Grant Program). In total the OSA has conducted reviews of five of the eight tobacco settlement programs. The list below summarizes the programs and the dates of the evaluations.

- Children's Basic Health Plan Trust (July 2000)
- Read to Achieve (July 2001)
- Nurse Home Visitor Program (August 2002)
- Veterans Trust Fund (June 2003)
- Comprehensive Primary and Preventative Care Grant Program (June 2003)

Audits of the three remaining programs (the Dental Loan Repayment Program, the Tobacco-Related and Tobacco-Focused Research Grant Program, and the Tobacco Education, Prevention, and Cessation Grant Program) are currently planned for completion in Calender Year 2004.

Attached are executive summaries of the two audits completed since our last update in November 2002. In addition, we have included the recommendation locators from each audit report. We will monitor the status of these recommendations and perform ongoing follow-up work as necessary.

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

#### **Veterans Trust Fund**

The Veterans Trust Fund was established to allocate a portion of tobacco settlement monies for veterans facilities and activities as specified in statute. The Veterans Trust Fund, located within the Department of Military and Veterans Affairs, oversees awards for capital improvements to state veterans nursing homes, costs incurred by state veterans cemeteries, veterans outreach programs, and other programs operated by qualifying nonprofit veterans organizations. Statutes specify that 75 percent of the Veterans Trust Fund's annual appropriation shall be retained as principle; the remaining 25 percent and interest earned is available for distribution to qualifying grantees. As of March 2003, the Trust Fund had received a total of almost \$2.9 million from tobacco settlement monies and interest. During Fiscal Years 2002 and 2003, 24 grants were awarded for a total of \$484,271. Our recommendations included standardizing and documenting the grant application, review, and award processes; establishing formal contracts with grantees; implementing formal grant award and disbursement processes; and improving grant monitoring procedures by adopting formal standards for determining the effectiveness of veterans programs.

#### **Comprehensive Primary and Preventative Care Grant Program**

The Department of Health Care Policy and Financing administers the Comprehensive Primary and Preventative Care Grant (CPPCG) Program, which provides grants to health care providers to expand health care services to Colorado's low-income, uninsured residents. Since the CPPCG Program began in Fiscal Year 2001, it has awarded a total of 32 grants to 27 different health care providers for a total of \$15.6 million. The Program has also pre-awarded \$3.4 million in grants for Fiscal Years 2004 and 2005, contingent upon funding availability. Our recommendations included improving program oversight and monitoring by administering and enforcing contracts, improving the evaluation of program effectiveness, strengthening the management of the grant award and funding processes, and clarifying and documenting the grant award process.
