### INTRODUCTION

The responsibility of the Colorado State Board of Education is to adopt goals and objectives for the State of Colorado concerning the improvement of the education of children in this state.

At the Board's February 2005 retreat, the following strategic plan was revised from the 2003 plan.

### **AUTHORITY**

- □ Article IX, Section 1 Colorado Constitution
  The general supervision of the public schools of the state shall be vested in a board of education.
- □ Article IX, Section 2 Colorado Constitution The general assembly shall provide for the establishment and maintenance of a thorough and uniform system of free public schools throughout the state.
- 22-2-106 Colorado Revised Statutes It is the duty of the State Board to exercise general supervision over the public schools of the state and the educational programs maintained and operated by all state governmental agencies for persons who have not completed the twelfth-grade level of instruction.

### **MISSION**

Charged by the Constitution of the State of Colorado with the general supervision of the public schools,

The mission of the Colorado State Board of Education is to provide all of Colorado's children equal access to quality, thorough, uniform, wellrounded educational opportunities in a safe and civil learning environment.

  - b. Participate in prioritization and protection of the budget, including libraries.
  - c. Continue our leadership in and educating the public about the School Lands Trust issue.

- 4. Improve educator quality, recruitment, retention, and placement.
  - a. Improve quality and accountability of preparation programs.
  - b. Support professional development that increases student achievement through teacher quality.
