A MESSAGE FROM THE SECRETARY

Dear Voter,

As Colorado's chief elections official, it is my pleasure to provide you with the 2011/2012 Colorado Military and Overseas Voters' Guide. With this guide we are providing military and overseas voters with information and application forms necessary to vote in Colorado's upcoming elections.

Colorado has a long history of encouraging and reaching out to its voters overseas. Through cooperation with our county clerks, my aim is to inform voters who will be stationed or travelling abroad about registration requirements and ways to cast a ballot while out of the country.

Historically, too few of Colorado's military serving overseas have participated or succeeded in casting their ballots. As a former soldier who served overseas, I know there are plenty of distractions and activities. It is my goal to identify impediments and find solutions to these obstacles. To that end, we will continue our work with the Colorado General Assembly and the military to find efficient and practical avenues for our overseas voters to exercise their right to vote.

Certainly, delivery and registration issues will arise and time will be critical to ensure these ballots are received and counted. This guide will provide military and other overseas voters the resources needed to plan ahead or address any issues that may arise with receiving or casting a ballot while overseas.

Please know that my office and the offices of the county clerks stand ready to assist in any way possible to ensure that these overseas ballots are relayed in an efficient and timely manner.

I hope this guide helps to answer or resolve any issues or questions that may arise. If it doesn't, please contact my office at elections@sos.state.co.us.

GENERAL INFORMATION

WHAT ARE THE QUALIFICATIONS TO REGISTER TO VOTE AS A COLORADO CITIZEN?

Every person who is 18 years of age or older at the time of the next election, a U.S. citizen, and a legal resident of Colorado is entitled to register and vote in Colorado. For the purposes of voter registration for overseas electors, “resident” means the person’s last legal residence prior to leaving the U.S. was in Colorado.

WHAT IS UOCAVA?

Colorado citizens who are living either temporarily or permanently overseas and all active military personnel who are absent from Colorado, including their spouses and voting-age dependants, are eligible to vote by mail under the Uniformed and Overseas Citizens and Absentee Voting Act (UOCAVA) and Colorado law.

WHO IS A MILITARY ELECTOR?

A military elector is defined as:

- A member of any active or reserve branch of the military who is a resident of Colorado but who is absent from the state on active duty;
- A member of the merchant marine who is a resident of Colorado but who is absent from the state serving in the merchant marine;
- A member of the Colorado National Guard who is a resident of this state, but who is absent from the state on active duty;
- A member of the commissioned corps of the Public Health Service or the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration who is working outside the United States; or
- A spouse or dependant of a person described above, who is a resident of Colorado but who is absent from the state because of the service member’s active duty or service.

(Section 1-8.3-102, C.R.S.)

WHO IS AN OVERSEAS ELECTOR?

An overseas elector is defined as:

- A resident of Colorado who is living outside the U.S., either temporarily or permanently,
- Who was a resident of Colorado immediately prior to leaving the U.S.

This includes U.S. citizens who have never resided in the U.S. as discussed below.

(Section 1-8.3-102, C.R.S.)



VOTER REGISTRATION & ABSENTEE BALLOT Q&A

WHAT IF I AM A U.S. CITIZEN, BUT I HAVE NEVER RESIDED IN THE U.S.?

If you are a U.S. citizen who has never resided in the U.S., you may register and vote in Colorado if your parent or legal guardian was a resident of Colorado before leaving the U.S. To register to vote, you should apply using your parent or guardian's last Colorado residence address

(Section 1-8.3-102), C.R.S.)

HOW DO I REGISTER TO VOTE AND REQUEST A BALLOT?

If you have a Colorado driver's license or identification card, log onto www.GoVoteColorado.com to use the online voter registration portal to register to vote, request a ballot, or update your registration information. The online form will allow you to indicate how you would like to receive your ballot.

If you prefer, you may submit a Federal Post Card Application or Standard Form 76 (FPCA) to your county clerk and recorder. The FPCA is a universal form used for both voter registration and absentee ballot request. The FPCA is available on the Federal Voting Assistance Program (FVAP) website at: <http://www.fvap.gov/FPCA/fpca-co.html>.

All military and overseas citizens are encouraged to review their registration information online and update it as necessary or submit a FPCA each year to update their information with the county clerk and recorder.

We strongly encourage all military and overseas voters to provide alternate contact information, including an e-mail address. This information will allow your county elections office to contact you about your ballot, and provide you with important election information. This information will not be made available to the public and will only be used for the purpose of communicating with you about the voting process.

(Section 1-8.3-115(1), C.R.S.)

WHICH U.S. ADDRESS DO I USE WHEN I REGISTER TO VOTE FROM OVERSEAS?

You must provide the complete street address of your Colorado voting residence. For overseas citizens, this is the last residence you maintained in Colorado prior to your departure. Even though you may no longer maintain formal ties to that residence, the address determines your proper voting jurisdiction. Please note that you must provide a residential address; a post office box is not sufficient.

You must also provide your current mailing address for the county to send you voting information, including your ballot. It is important that if your mailing address changes you update it quickly with the county elections office so that you continue to receive elections and voting information.



WHAT IS THE DEADLINE TO SUBMIT AN APPLICATION FOR VOTER REGISTRATION AND TO REQUEST A MAIL-IN BALLOT?

An elector must submit an application for voter registration no later than the 29th day before the election.

Please note that if you wish to vote in a Primary Election, you must be affiliated with a participating party. If you wish to change your affiliation from one party to another, you must do so no later than the 29th day prior to the Primary Election. If you are unaffiliated and wish to declare an affiliation, you may do so up to and on election day.

The county must receive an application for a ballot no later than the close of business on the 7th day before the election if you wish to receive the ballot by mail. Military and overseas voters may also request to have their ballots be sent by fax or e-mail. If you would like to receive the ballot by fax or e-mail, the request must be received no later than the close of business on the Friday before the election. Please keep in mind that if you would like to receive the ballot by mail, 7 days may not be sufficient to receive, vote, and return your ballot.

(Section 1-8.3-109, C.R.S.)

DO I NEED TO SUBMIT A SEPARATE BALLOT APPLICATION FOR EACH ELECTION?

Submission of a FPCA serves as a request to receive a ballot for all state and federal elections held through the next regularly scheduled general election. Military and overseas voters must submit an updated request prior to each general election unless they have requested a permanent mail-in ballot.

All Colorado citizens may request a permanent mail-in ballot. You may request a permanent mail-in ballot by selecting “Yes, I want to be a permanent mail-in voter and automatically receive a mail-in ballot for all applicable elections” in the online voter registration application, or making a note in the “Additional Information” section (box 6) of the FPCA. Keep in mind that if you choose this option you must update your information with the county clerk and recorder frequently in order to ensure that you will receive your ballot. We recommend submitting an updated FPCA each year to ensure the county clerk and recorder has your most current information.

HOW WILL I KNOW IF MY APPLICATION IS RECEIVED?

Once the county elections office has processed your application, the county will mail you a postcard. If your application is incomplete for any reason, the county will send you a letter advising you what additional information is required. You may also check the status of your application and ballot online at www.GoVoteColorado.com.

HOW CAN I VERIFY THAT MY VOTER REGISTRATION INFORMATION IS COMPLETE?

To review your voter registration information, log on to the Election Center page of the Secretary of State website and click on Verify/Update My Record. You may also use the following link: www.GoVoteColorado.com. You will need to enter your first and last name, date of birth, and the zip



code of your residential address in Colorado to access your information. You will be able to review your mailing address, precinct and district information, party affiliation, and contact information for your county clerk and recorder, as well as track the status of your ballot during an election.

WHEN SHOULD I RECEIVE MY BALLOT BY MAIL?

Counties will mail ballots to military and overseas voters 45 days before the election. You should receive your ballot within two weeks after it has been mailed by the county. You can also check whether your ballot has been mailed through the registration verification tool on the Secretary of State website at www.GoVoteColorado.com.

WHAT IF I DON'T RECEIVE MY BALLOT?

If you have not received your ballot two weeks before the election, contact your county elections office. Your county clerk and recorder will be able to assist you in determining the status of your ballot, or issue a replacement ballot if necessary. You can find contact information for county elections offices is on page 9. You can find additional contact information on the Military and Overseas Electors page of the Secretary of State website at <http://www.sos.state.co.us/pubs/elections/UOCAVA.html>.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE AND RETURN A BALLOT BY FAX OR E-MAIL?

All military and overseas voters may request to receive and return their ballot by fax or e-mail. If you would like to receive your ballot by fax, be sure to provide your county elections office with a complete fax number, including the international prefix and country code. If requesting a ballot by e-mail, provide a complete e-mail address where the ballot is to be transmitted.

If you request to receive your ballot by e-mail, you will receive the blank ballot as a PDF attachment to an e-mail. In order to return your voted ballot by e-mail, you must print and vote the ballot, then scan it and attach it as a PDF to an e-mail.

It is important to note that if you choose to return your voted ballot by fax or e-mail, you must voluntarily waive your right to a secret ballot.

WHAT IS A FEDERAL WRITE-IN BALLOT?

Any military or overseas voter is entitled to vote by a Federal Write-in Absentee Ballot (FWAB). You may use the FWAB to cast votes for all federal, state, and local races and issues you are eligible to vote on. You may designate the candidate by writing in the name of the candidate or by writing in the name of a political party or political organization, in which case the ballot will be counted for the candidate of that political party or political organization.

If the county has received and processed an application for a Colorado mail-in ballot and processed but a FWAB is returned, the county will count the FWAB. However, if you return both a regular Colorado ballot and a FWAB, the county will void the FWAB and count the votes from the regular Colorado ballot.



You may obtain a FWAB from federal and civilian Voting Assistance Officers, or on the Federal Voting Assistance Program website at www.fvap.gov.

WHAT IS THE DEADLINE FOR RETURNING MY VOTED BALLOT?

All military or overseas voters must vote and return their ballots by 7:00 p.m. Mountain Time on Election Day. The county elections office must receive the ballots no later than the close of business on the 8th day after Election Day.

(Sections 1-8.3-111 and 1-8.3-113(2), C.R.S.)

WHAT IF I AM NO LONGER A UOCAVA ELECTOR OR I HAVE BEEN REASSIGNED TO A NEW LOCATION?

If the address listed on your application changes due to reassignment or if you return to the U.S., you will need to update your voter registration by contacting your county elections office. The best way to update your voter registration is to log onto www.GoVoteColorado.com to update your registration information. If you prefer, you may also submit an updated FPCA, which is available online at <http://www.fvap.gov/FPCA/fpca-co.html>.

HOW CAN I VOTE IF I WAS RECENTLY DISCHARGED BUT THE DEADLINE FOR REGISTRATION HAS ALREADY PASSED?

Uniformed service members who were serving outside the U.S. and were discharged from the military after the close of registration may register to vote in person at the county clerk and recorder's office. You will need to complete an emergency registration and note that the reason for the emergency registration is discharge from active duty.

(Section 1-2-217.5(2)(e), C.R.S.)

Important deadlines for 2011:

Saturday, September 17: Counties will mail ballots for the November 1 Coordinated Election to all military and overseas electors who have requested one.

Monday, October 3: Close of voter registration for the November 2011 Coordinated Election.

Tuesday, October 25: Deadline to request a ballot if the ballot will be sent by mail.

Friday, October 28: Deadline to request a ballot that will be sent by electronic transmission.

Tuesday, November 1: Election Day. Military and overseas electors must vote and transmit ballots by 7:00pm MT.

Wednesday, November 9: Deadline for military and overseas ballots to be received by the county clerk and recorder.

Important deadlines for 2012:

Saturday, May 12: Counties will mail ballots for the June 26 state Primary Election to all military and overseas electors who are affiliated with a participating political party and have requested a ballot.

Tuesday, May 29: Close of voter registration for the June 2012 state Primary Election.

Tuesday, June 19: Deadline to request a ballot if the ballot will be sent by mail.

Friday, June 22: Deadline to request a ballot that will be sent by electronic transmission.

Tuesday, June 26: Election Day. Military and overseas electors must vote and transmit ballots by 7:00pm MT.

Thursday, July 5: Deadline for military and overseas ballots to be received by the county clerk and recorder.

Saturday, September 22: Counties will mail ballots for the November 6 General Election to all military and overseas electors who have requested one.

Tuesday, October 9: Close of voter registration for the November 2012 General Election.

Tuesday, October 30: Deadline to request a ballot if the ballot will be sent by mail.

Friday, November 2: Deadline to request a ballot that will be sent by electronic transmission.

Tuesday, November 6: Election Day. Military and overseas electors must vote and transmit ballots by 7:00pm MT.

Wednesday, November 14: Deadline for military and overseas ballots to be received by the county clerk and recorder.
