195. Press Release dated 11 July, issued by Uichi Hasegawa, Research Committee for Defence of Human Rights, Tokyo, Japan, relating to a "protest meeting against the Nagy case", held on 8 July in Tokyo, jointly sponsored by Hungarian Relief Society, Japan Trade Union Congress (Zenro), Student Association and the above organisation. 3/

196. Letter dated 11 July from 152 members and associates of the Japan Cultural Forum, Japan Committee, Congress for Cultural Freedom, Tokyo, requesting "that the United Nations take immediately every possible measure in conformity with the Charter of the United Nations, to eradicate the possibility of inhuman deeds of this kind in the future and also to maintain the international faith".

197. Letter dated 15 July from Dr. Alexander Gallus, President, The Committee of Nationals from Countries behind the Iron Curtain, Melbourne, Australia, transmitting a resolution adopted by the above Committee, which urges the United Nations (a) "to take collective measures against the aggressor"; (b) to exclude "the Sovietimposed Kadar-regime from the exercise of rights and privileges of United Nations The Union Membership"; (c) to suspend the membership of Soviet Private "as long as compliance with the resolutions of the United Nations Assembly has not become apparent."

198. Cable dated 17 July from Edgardo Marmo, President, F.E.U.E., Guayaquil, Ecuador, protesting against the executions and also "condemning/the Hungarian Government for the persecution of students".

199. Copies of an undated resolution adopted by the United Hungarian Societies of Cleveland, Ohio, received on 22 July, expressing "gratitude and deep appreciation inter alia to the United Nations"for their strong and determined stand condemning the mass executions, deportations, and terrorism by the tyrannical forces of communism against the freedom loving people of Hungary". The resolution also requests the

Congress and Senate of the United States "to call for the United Nations to continue the investigation of the Hungarian Case".

200. Cable dated 24 July from Stefan Korbonski, kaking Chairman, Assembly of Captive European Nations, New York, "congratulating" the Special Committee on the and Special Report, expressing the hope "that responsible organs of the United Nations and its member States will forthwith make recommendations for appropriate United Nations measures".

Captive European Nations, New York, requesting the Secretary-General "to avail himself of authority conferred by the General Assembly resolution 1004 ES-11 of November 4, 1956" and to suggest methods to bring an end to the foreign intervention in Hungary in accordance with the principles of the Charter of the United urges Nations". The cable also skepes that "in view of reports of further secret trials and impending judicial murders in Hungary" adequate preventive action with be taken "to save human lives and at the same time exercise the important responsibility which United Nations the General Assembly has specifically delegated to the kinks Secretary General".
