Dear Director Neslin:

Last week, the COGCC sent out an information request asking for data and interpretive responses regarding the cost of compliance with the proposed Draft Rules in fourteen areas, including analysis of their impacts on industry operations and suggested alternatives. I regret to inform you that the Colorado Oil & Gas Association (including a group of its member companies coordinating their rulemaking participation under the auspices of the association; together, "COGA"), will not be responding to this information request. Essentially, this request asks for exactly the sort of information that will inform, at least in part, COGA's prehearing statement. As such, it would be inappropriate and prejudicial to provide this information, in advance, to the COGCC and, thereby, to the other parties.

This is not to mention that the scope of the COGCC's inquiry exceeds the time and resources available to COGA, as we are stretched to the limit in preparing our own case. Please refer to COGA's Request for Party Status for additional discussion regarding our concerns about the scope of this rulemaking, the compressed schedule to prepare for it, the arbitrary page limits on the prehearing statements, and the inadequacy of the time allotted for hearing party testimony.

COGA also believes that it was inappropriate to send this information request to local governments, nongovernmental organizations, and other participants in the "technical work groups" that have no qualifications to provide this sort of data. Finally, this sort of analysis should have been conducted by the COGCC as part of the rule development, and should have informed their scope and complexity.
