#### **District Stats**

178 districts

- $\rightarrow$  105 of the 178 meet the definition of *small* rural
- $\rightarrow$  43 of the 178 meet the definition of rural
- ightarrow These 148 (80 percent of total districts) rural districts comprise only 20 percent (just more than 150,000) of the total student population in the state

83 districts have less than 500 students

#### **Colorado Schools**

1,818 schools:

- $\rightarrow$  1,055 elementary schools
- → 290 middle schools
- ightarrow 473 high schools

Enrollment has grown every year since 1988, when the total enrollment was 560,081.

Colorado has seen nearly 41 percent growth in student enrollment in the last two decades.

### **Charter, Innovation and Online Schools**

- → 187 charter schools serving approximately 89,850 students (PK-12)
- → 47 districts authorize charter schools in Colorado (including Charter School Institute)
- → 42 innovation schools serving approximately 21,164 students (PK-12)
- ightarrow 6 innovation districts serving approximately 127,958 students
- → 17,582 students (PK-12) attending online school

<sup>\*</sup>Starting in 2009-2010, the method Colorado uses to calculate the graduation rate changed. In the past, early and late graduates were folded into the current graduating class. Under the new formula, students who exit a school or district to attend a GED program remain in the "membership base" (the graduation rate denominator) and thereby reduce the graduation rate for their graduating class.
