Pursuant to §C.R.S. 24-33.5-113 An Act Concerning Evidence Collected in Connection With a Sexual Assault, and, in Connection Therewith, Making an Appropriation

Presents a: <u>Plan on Analyzing Forensic Medical Evidence</u>

Executive Summary:

During Colorado's 69th General Assembly in 2013, legislation was proposed and identified as HB13-1020. This bill called *An Act Concerning Evidence Collected in Connection with a Sexual Assault, and, in Connection Therewith, Making an Appropriation*, became law on June 5, 2013 and is stipulated in Colorado Revised Statutes § 24-33.5-113.

The Colorado Department of Safety is required to implement three facets of this law:

1) Promulgate rules to clarify the requirements for law enforcement to submit all forensic medical evidence to either a the Colorado Bureau of Investigation (CBI) Forensic Services laboratory or another accredited laboratory for analysis within 21 days of receipt from medical personnel.

Promulgation of rules was completed on October 2, 2013. (See attachment 1)

2) Request all law enforcement agencies to submit an inventory to the CBI of all forensic medical evidence in their possession previously not submitted.

Inventory was completed with an 86% return rate. (See attachment 2)

- 3) Require the CBI to present a plan to analyze:
 - a. The backlog of forensic medical evidence previously not submitted;
 - b. All future submissions of forensic medical evidence mandated by this law.

Response to the 3rd facet of the law:

3a. Plan for analyzing the backlog of forensic medical evidence previously not submitted

Per the new statue: §24-33.5-113, 4 (a) "within 90 days of effective date of this section, each law enforcement agency shall submit to the CBI an inventory...."

The CBI created and electronically distributed an excel spreadsheet to all local, county and state law enforcement agencies with a request to inventory the forensic medical evidence in their respective vaults previously not submitted. These agencies were to complete a spreadsheet with all of the pertinent information. This spreadsheet was distributed to 255 agencies; responses were received from 220 agencies, an 86.27% return rate.

In compiling the submitted data, the CBI determined there are 5,889 kits (forensic medical evidence) in total with 4,741 potentially meeting the criteria for outsourcing. Kits may not be suitable for outsourcing for a variety of reasons including expiration of the statute of limitations or they have been adjudicated (See Table 1).

Accredited outsourcing DNA laboratories have been contacted and specifications are being created for posting per the State of Colorado's procurement policy and procedures. Once the bid is awarded and the mandatory site visits to these outsourcing laboratories are conducted per FBI requirements, the project is expected to commence by January 1, 2014.

With the current appropriation of \$6,351,002 and based upon estimates of the cost for shipping evidence to the outsourcing lab(s), analysis of evidence, testifying costs and shipment of evidence back to the CBI, it is estimated that approximately 2,750 to 3,000 cases can be analyzed. This projection includes cases from 2009 through 2013. However, until the contracts are awarded and analysis begins, a final number of cases cannot be stated with certainty.

3b. Plan for analyzing future submissions

In order to accurately and judiciously plan for the resources that will be necessary to analyze all future submissions of forensic medical evidence, it was imperative to collect reliable data in support of projections related to the increase in volume of kits submitted for testing. Unfortunately, conclusive data is not available either through law enforcement or our hospitals, even those with Sexual Assault Nurse Examination Programs (SANE). There has been no requirement to maintain clear and concise records regarding the number of sexual assaults reported, how many of those were investigated or the number involving the collection of evidence. In fact, there are some hospitals that maintain no records regarding sexual assaults. Furthermore, because HB13-1020 did not define the requirements for a sexual assault case to be considered active, the inventory submitted by our law enforcement partners produced data that at best was incomplete and at worst, inadequate for the purpose of determining the number of cases the CBI will analyze going forward.

Considering the above, the CBI had to utilize the best data available to estimate future submissions. Our strategy included the following:

- Collecting data regarding alleged sexual assaults between 2004 and 2013 from the National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS). This information produced no pattern or average of percent change from one year to the next. (See Table 2)
- Analyzing statistics from the Sexual Assault Response Project—a study conducted by Division of Criminal Justice of seven rural sites and the 17th Judicial District in 2011 and 2012. This study determined that, on average, 65% of all law enforcement reports alleging sexual assault resulted in an exam. (See Table 3)
- Using the 65% as a benchmark and applying this percent to the data collected from NIBRS of annual sexual assaults for 2012, predicting an annual number of sexual assault cases that will require examination. (See Table 4)

Request for Resources

In order to better understand our request for resources, it is necessary to identify the resources needed to conduct DNA analysis of forensic medical evidence. The following information describes the resources needed for what we will refer to as one "setup". Current technology for the analysis of DNA utilizes robotics to maximize efficiencies in the process. The maximum capacity for one Hamilton Robot is as follows:

- One forensic scientist utilizes the robot to process 20 cases per month;
- The robot runs four weeks per month;
- A maximum of four forensic scientists can operate one robot each month;
- A total of 80 cases can be analyzed each month per robot;

- Considering all leave time (training, testifying in court), the robots are utilized 10 months per year per staff member.
- One robot being used by four forensic scientists can analyze a maximum of 800 cases per year.

Each "setup" will require the appropriate allotment of the following:

- One Hamilton Robot
- Four FTE DNA scientists
- Equipment for DNA analysis (Automates, Quantitative Analysis, Amplification, Genetic Analyzer)
- DNA analysis software (Genemapper)
- Other lab equipment and general operating expenses
- DNA analysis commodities (reagents and chemicals)
- Equipment maintenance
- 2,536 square feet of laboratory space

Using the data collected from NIBRS regarding the number of sexual assault offenses for 2012, and assuming the 65% ratio of actual kits taken plus subtracting out the 400 cases annually that CBI currently processes, we begin with an incremental number of 3252 cases in the first year (See Table 4). The following details the number of setups required in order to process 3252 additional cases. With the assumption that the cases submitted will remain stagnant or increase slightly, this number provides a satisfactory indicator to determine the equipment and personnel necessary going forward.

Assuming four additional setups, or 16 DNA Forensic Scientists, this will require an additional manager, evidence technician and administrative assistant.

Conclusion

In conclusion, the CBI believes that the 65% indicated in Table 4 represents a plausible factor to determine the approximate number of cases to be analyzed by the agency going forward.

Projecting future submissions is challenging; the impact the passage of HB13-1020 will have is difficult to measure, especially relative to how public awareness may persuade a victim to report and consent to an exam.

RULES AND REGULATIONS CONCERNING EVIDENCE COLLECTION IN CONNECTION WITH SEXUAL ASSAULTS

STATEMENT OF BASIS, STATUTORY AUTHORITY, AND PURPOSE

Pursuant to Section § 24-33.5-113 C.R.S., the Executive Director of the Colorado Department of Public Safety shall promulgate rules and regulations concerning evidence collection in connection with sexual assaults.

It was declared by the General Assembly that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of Colorado citizens. The absence of implementing rules to carry out the purpose of the statute would be contrary to this declaration. For these reasons, it is imperatively necessary that the proposed rules be adopted.

RULES AND REGULATIONS CONCERNING FORENSIC MEDICAL EVIDENCE COLLECTION IN CONNECTION WITH SEXUAL ASSAULTS IN THE STATE OF COLORADO

AUTHORITY

The Colorado Department of Public Safety Executive Director is mandated to promulgate rules and regulations concerning forensic medical evidence collection in connection with sexual assaults pursuant to CRS § 24-33.5-113.

DEFINITIONS

The following definitions apply to these rules and regulations:

"Accredited Crime Laboratory" means a law enforcement crime laboratory which has received forensic accreditation through ASCLD/LAB (American Society of Crime Laboratory/Laboratory Accreditation Board) Legacy or ISO/IEC (International Organization of Standardization/International Electrotechnical Commission) 17025:2005 by a recognized accrediting body.

"Backlog" as referenced in C.R.S § 24-33.5-113 means all unanalyzed collected forensic medical evidence stored in any law enforcement facility in the State of Colorado. All forensic medical evidence received by law enforcement entities as part of an active investigation shall be considered "backlog" until the date these rules become effective.

"CODIS" (COmbined DNA Index System) means a database system controlled by the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) authorizing individuals within an accredited crime laboratory to utilize the system upon successful completion of a FBI QAS (Quality Assurance Standards) audit.

"Forensic Evidence" as referenced in section 113 (b) (I) of CRS § 24-33.5-113 means forensic medical evidence.

"Forensic Medical Evidence" means evidence collected by medical or law enforcement personnel using a sexual assault evidence collection kit (or components thereof) consistent with state/national collection standards. This excludes any toxicological evidence.

"Forensic evidence analysis/release of results" for the purposes of this law means that any results from the forensic analysis conducted will be released to the submitting agency.

APPLICABILITY

These rules and regulations apply to all personnel who participate in any or all parts of the collection, transportation, storage, forensic analysis, investigation, and the judicial process of forensic medical evidence in connection to alleged sexual assaults occurring in the State of Colorado. These rules must be complied with by March 1, 2014.

CONSENT

Forensic medical evidence must be collected if a victim of an alleged sexual assault requests the collection. Law enforcement and medical personnel shall not, for any reason, discourage a victim of an alleged sexual assault from receiving a forensic medical examination.

Any person who receives forensic medical evidence or the results of those tests conducted on the forensic medical evidence shall not disclose that information except for the authorized purpose for which that forensic medical evidence was obtained.

The <u>COLORADO SEXUAL ASSAULT CONSENT AND INFORMATION FORM</u> must be utilized to obtain consent from and provide information to sexual assault victims regarding:

- 1) Evidence collection through a medical forensic exam;
- 2) Forensic evidence analysis/release of results;
- 3) Reporting options; and
- 4) Victims' ability to withdraw consent.

This form must be used beginning March 1, 2014. This form should be utilized prior to the collection of forensic medical evidence whether collected by medical or law enforcement personnel.

Consent or non-consent must be confirmed through the victim's initials and signature on the form.

Sexual assault victims may withdraw their consent for evidence collection and forensic evidence analysis/release of results. However, consent for analysis/release of results cannot be withdrawn once forensic analysis has been initiated by a qualified employee of an accredited crime laboratory.

Withdrawal of consent becomes effective when the investigating law enforcement agency verifies that the person seeking to withdraw consent is the victim who is acting of her/his own free will. If possible, law enforcement should obtain written confirmation of the withdrawal from the victim.

If the evidence collection kit is in the custody of the accredited crime lab when the withdrawal of consent becomes effective, law enforcement must notify the accredited crime lab about the withdrawal as soon as possible, but no later than the second business day after consent has been withdrawn and victim identification has been verified.

Law enforcement must make a reasonable attempt to verify the identity of the person seeking to withdraw consent. If law enforcement cannot verify the identity of the person seeking to withdraw consent, or does not believe the victim is acting of her/his own free will, consent cannot be withdrawn.

FORENSIC ANALYSIS

Beginning on March 1, 2014, all forensic medical evidence received by a law enforcement entity must be submitted to the Colorado Bureau of Investigation or an accredited crime laboratory for analysis within 21 days of receipt of such evidence except under the following circumstances:

- 1) The victim has not consented or has withdrawn consent to have the forensic analysis conducted;
- 2) A law enforcement investigation has corroborating evidence that the alleged sexual assault never occurred; or
- 3) The law enforcement entity is not the investigating agency and must forward the forensic medical evidence to the appropriate agency of jurisdiction for submission as soon as possible.

Upon submission to an accredited crime laboratory, that laboratory must strive to analyze and, when appropriate, upload the information into CODIS within six (6) months of receipt of the forensic medical evidence being submitted, assuming the laboratory has sufficient resources.

The appropriate accredited crime laboratory must report the results of the forensic analysis upon completion of the analysis to the submitting agency.

LAW ENFORCEMENT

Law enforcement agencies must submit their backlog of untested forensic medical evidence for analysis to the Colorado Bureau of Investigation or another accredited crime laboratory no later than March 1, 2014.

These rules apply whether the forensic medical evidence is submitted to the Colorado Bureau of Investigation or to another accredited crime laboratory.
