We submit herewith our Forty-Third Annual Report showing the assessed valuations of the various classes of property together with the valuations, levies and revenue for county, school and municipal purposes in each county of the State.

STATE VALUATION

The total assessed valuation of Colorado as submitted in our annual report to the State Board of Equalization on September 15, 1954, was as follows:

Valuation of all property assessed by county assessors \$2,386,889,662, this figure includes \$6,235,520 added to valuations of Weld county as ordered by the State Board of Equalization upon recommendation of Colorado Tax Commission.

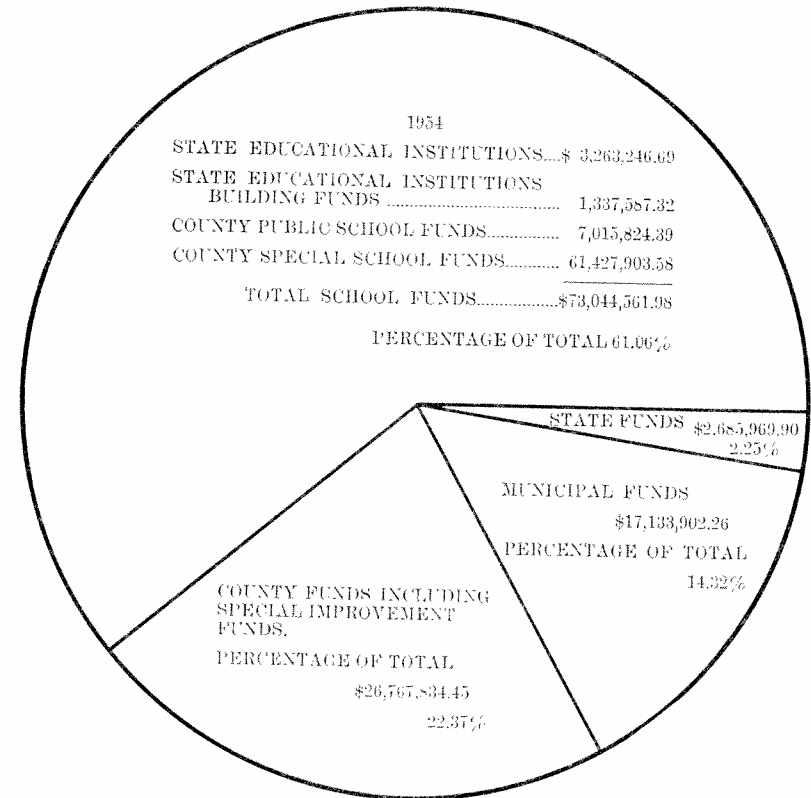
