REPORT

OF THE

BOARD OF CAPITOL MANAGERS

OF THE

STATE OF COLORADO.

Denver, Colorado, December 1, 1898.

To the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

In accordance with section 7 of an act of the general assembly of the state of Colorado, entitled "An act to provide for the erection and completion of a state capitol building at the city of Denver and creating a board of management and supervision," the board of capitol managers respectfully presents the following report of its transactions since December 1, 1896, the date of its last report:

The eleventh general assembly, by an act approved April 12, 1897, repealed section 1 of the above act and enacted other provisions pertaining thereto and otherwise altered and amended said act.

Among other provisions it created a new board of capitol managers for the purpose of supervising and directing the construction, completion and furnishing of the state capitol building, laying out, improving and ornamenting the grounds thereof, and assigning to its care and control the building and grounds, the members of said board to serve without any salary or compensation until the entire completion and furnishing of said building.

April 30, 1897, the new board, consisting of five members appointed by the aforesaid act, to wit, the governor of the state,

John L. Routt, Otto Mears, Chas. J. Hughes, Jr., and Job A. Cooper, proceeded to organize, Chief Justice Hayt administering the oath of office. Herman Lueders was elected secretary. and James Murdoch, superintendent.

June 1, the chairman gave notice that ex-Governor John L. Routt had tendered his resignation as a member of the board and that he had appointed George Tritch to fill the vacancy.

June 30, 1898, Superintendent Murdoch tendered his resignation, which was accepted.

F. E. Edbrooke was appointed architectural adviser, October 3, 1898.

Outside of the routine business of the board, the following is a review of the important transactions:

MARBLE.

Under the provisions of the act. approved March 31, 1897, appropriating \$89,500 to be used for the purpose of finishing the interior marble decorations by the contractor, according to the plans and designs of the superintendent of the building, which action of the general assembly was probably caused through some misconception, said plans not having been approved by the board, the latter, on June 30, and July 31, 1897, awarded the following work to The Denver Onyx and Marble Manufacturing Company, under its bid, No. 14, being the lowest received for Colorado marble, opened February 1, 1894:

The last contract is now \$1,729.72 less than the original bid, the reduction being based upon the change of twelve-inch square white tiles with three-inch square black dots to eight by sixteen-inch plain ashlar tiles.

The foregoing, in addition to the contracts let in 1894 and 1895, comprises all the marble work contemplated, with the exception of the stairwork from basement to second floor; the lining of the dome walls, first to second floor, as shown by the plans adopted by the eleventh general assembly; the changing of iron pedestals on twenty columns in corridors, first floor, to marble pedestals, and for four bulletin boards.

Owing to the slow progress of the wainscoting, most of which was contracted for three years ago, and the uncertainty

as to the further time required to complete this work, the board considered it inexpedient to undertake the necessary stone cutting, masonry and brick work, as well as the removal of the plaster work from pilasters, to prepare the walls of the dome for the marble liming, although bids for this part of the work had been considered, September 30, 1897, and the lowest, being from Greenlee & Sons, at \$648, accepted.

The question also presented itself, considering the time consumed in the completion of the wainscoting, whether the contractors would be able to furnish sufficient and suitable material for the lining of the dome, and whether they had the facilities for curving the slabs as required in this contract.

As to the stair work, the same being a part of the design to complete the interior of the dome, it was questionable, when the contractors would be in a position to furnish treads and risers of Colorado marble, of the dimensions required, as it had taken them four years since the letting of the first contract for tiling of the floors, to complete this work, for which material only eight by sixteen-inch in size was used.

While there may be an abundance of native marble, the board has learned from actual experience that, in order to furnish sufficient material of the character desired, the contractors had to labor under many difficulties, owing to the undeveloped condition of the quarries, and although five years have elapsed since the question of finishing the interior of the building with Colorado marble was first considered, it appears that nobody is prepared to contract for the delivery of marble in quantities. Notwithstanding, the board has endeavored to make as good progress as possible. It became necessary, considering the difficulties encountered by the contractors, to grant them all the latitude to secure such material as was required by extending the time limits of their contracts.

November 13, 1898, they applied for an extension until December 31, 1899, on that part of their work which calls for the use of Beulah marble in the wainscoting, but owing to the short time intervening before the session of the general assembly, the board concluded to defer the matter, so as to permit the legislature to take such action as it may deem for the best interest of the state.

Several months ago, while the contractors, in view of the urgent entreaties of the board, were endeavoring to complete the tile work, various allegations and charges were published in several newspapers, none of which have as yet been substan-

tiated, that foreign, instead of Colorado, marble was being used in this work. The attention of the superintendent, Mr. Murdoch, was called to these rumors, with instructions to investigate them, and not to grant any estimates unless convinced that the contract was being carried out to the letter. He assured the members, individually, that he had convinced himself that the charges were unfounded.

After the appointment of Mr. F. E. Edbrooke, as architectural adviser, he was likewise instructed to make strict investigations, and although he courted the fullest information from those making charges, nothing has been presented to the board to prove the allegations.

As to the contractors, they have denied all charges and accusations by affidavits, etc., claiming that no other marble but Colorado ever has or will be used in the execution of the work.

November 15, the contractors, requesting a settlement for the tile work previously performed, the board passed the following resolution:

Whereas, It has been charged that the marble used for tiling by The Denver Onyx and Marble Mannfacturing Company, on the first, second and third floors of the capitol building, is not Colorado marble or in accordance with the contract for the same; it is hereby

Resolved, That the supervising architect be instructed to give estimates thereon, based upon the bid of The Denver Onyx and Marble Manufacturing Company for Vermont or eastern marble, the matter of determining whether or not the marble used is Colorado marble, and in accordance with the contract, being reserved for further investigation and determination by the board; and all estimates and payments made prior to such determination are made and must be accepted subject to the condition of this resolution; and it is further

NEW WORK, CHANGES AND REFURNISHING.

Resolved, That all showings upon this question must be presented by said company, and those making said charge, to the board within sixty days from this date.

The following new work on the building, including changes and refnrnishing, has been completed:

Bronze finish of staircases in dome from basement to second floor, and second and third floor galleries and corridor balustrades.

Bronze bases for columns in corridors, first, second and 'hird floors,

Bronze grille work, frame and glass, house of representatives and corridors.

Iron grilles, to protect windows of mining bureau.

The floor lights in corridors of first floor have been removed and two elliptic balustrades of aluminum bronze placed around the openings, thereby furnishing additional ventilation and light to basement floor.

The floor opening over law library, third floor, which was to be surrounded by rail and balusters, has been closed. Steel beams had to be framed and fire-proof terra cotta arches and a concrete floor constructed. This change added to the floor space.

The judges' chambers of both the supreme court and court of appeals, clerks' offices, judges' consultation rooms, and the ladies' reception room, have been painted and decorated in oil and the woodwork refinished. Likewise the rooms of the mining bureau, war relics and historical society.

All of the outside woodwork of the building has been painted.

After a thorough investigation as to the benefits and reduction of expense by an artesian well, to supply the boilers with pure water, thereby prolonging their life, avoiding scaling, pitting and corrosion, as well as the cost of compounds and repairs, the board, July 30, 1898, resolved to contract for the boring of a well. Work was begun in September, and after several unexpected mishaps the contractor has reached a depth of four hundred feet, but expects to sink to seven hundred feet before a good supply will be found. Should a sufficient flow be obtained to furnish the building, in addition to the boilers, there will be an annual saving of about one thousand dollars.

In order to obtain a better draught for the boilers, a brick extension to the smoke stack has been built.

All steam pipes for heating have been thoroughly overhauled and placed in condition for the coming season.

Furniture has been purchased for the rooms of the judges of the supreme court and court of appeals, and most of these offices newly carpeted. Senate and house received covering for furniture and chandeliers.

Tables and chairs were provided for committee rooms and book cases, show cases and other furniture, as needed, supplied to the different departments.

The law and state libraries have received additional book cases and will require more in the immediate future.

STATE EXHIBITS.

The bureau of mines has the most exhaustive collection of mineral and geological specimens in the West. This department is visited by all the scientists and those interested in the great mining industry of the state.

To this department was added room 32, previously occupied by the Historical and Natural History Society, and fifteen new show cases and tables purchased and the necessary shelving provided.

The Horticultural Society has a magnificent exhibit of fruits and cereals of our state, which is not only a surprise and revelation to visitors from abroad, but to many of our own citizens. This department has been furnished with oak cases and tables, book cases, glass jars and bottles, shelving and other articles.

The State Historical and Natural History Society was first assigned to rooms 30, 32 and 33, and opened to the public in a regular and permanent way, August 14, 1896. It has since been removed to rooms 14, 15, 16, 17, 19 and 20, and in order to give as much space as possible on account of the increase of the collection, an oak partition, with glass windows and doors, was erected across the corridor, which added another large room for the stuffed birds and animals.

The curator, Will C. Ferril, has kept a record of the visitors and reports that during the fiscal years of 1897 and 1898 the number was 123,582.

This department was furnished with one vault door and fourteen show cases and shelving.

War Relics.—This exhibit attracts great attention, and the board has endeavored to add to the collection by providing the necessary expenses, such as traveling, freight, drayage, etc. Traveling expenses were allowed the custodian to visit arsenals and navy yards in order to select such articles as would be of interest to the state, which were furnished by the general government free of cost.

Cecil H. Deane, who inaugurated the exhibit by donating his private collection of war relics, providing the state would assume charge and furnish space in the capitol building, was appointed custodian at \$45 per month.

These departments are all located in the basement and provided with quarters by acts of the legislature, but have never been included in the estimates of appropriations for "Mainten-

ance" and "Furnishing," although the board has allowed what was actually required.

As the collections are increasing, more furniture will be needed during the next two years, and a liberal allowance should be made for this purpose and for their maintenance.

CAPITOL GROUNDS.

One hundred and fifty-eight trees and shrubs, having decayed during the first year after planting, were removed and replaced by the contractor free of charge, in accordance with his guarantee given when the contract for furnishing trees was awarded at the opening of the season in 1897.

During the present year only sixteen had to be replaced, in addition to which the board added some ornamental trees of different variety.

Notwithstanding the use of a large quantity of fertilizer annually, the soil of the lawn is of such an unproductive character, that it requires the constant attention of seven men during six months of the year, and the use of a large quantity of water to keep the grass and trees in a good condition.

The amount paid for water for the lawn during the years 1897 and 1898 was \$2,353.55.

It is, however, a matter of pride that the sight of the grounds during the summer, presenting such a pleasant appearance, received the favorable comment of every stranger visiting the capitol.

The bronze statuary, "The Closing Era," presented by prominent ladies of Denver for the adornment of the grounds, has been permanently located, by the consent of the donors, within a circle opposite the east entrance of the building. It is placed upon a pedestal of Colorado granite from the Cotopaxi quarry.

May 5, 1898, the board granted the petition of the Colorado Society of the Sons of the Revolution for the erection of a flag pole and the raising of a national flag, at their own expense, to be dedicated to the National Guard of Colorado, and permitted the use of the circle on the west side of the grounds, near Broadway, the property to be owned by the state, and to remain under its control after the public dedication, to be held June 14, Flag day, which ceremony took place on that date.

Previous to ornamenting and beautifying the grounds, in 1895, the board obtained from the city, through its engineer, a certificate, now on file in this office, establishing the corners

and sidewalk grades, according to the official survey of H. C. Brown's second addition to the city of Denver, and the official map and profiles on file at the city engineer's office, for which the board paid \$295.92.

In order to further legalize the grades so established, the city council, in July, 1895, passed an ordinance, adopting the same as fixed by city engineer, P. O'Brien.

On account of the recent paving of Colfax avenue and the changing of the grade on said street by the board of public works, without consent of this board, it will be necessary to readjust the drives, walks and lawns from Lincoln avenue to Sherman avenue to conform with the new grade.

The estimated cost of this work, in accordance with a plan adopted October 31, 1898, will be \$3.929.40, not including the removal and replacing of the grass, trees and shrubbery.

August 13, 1898, the board adopted the following resolution:

Resolved, That that portion of Colfax avenue along the frontage of the capitol grounds, between Broadway and Grant avenue, should be paved and curbed in the manner of the other paying and enring now in progress on Colfax avenue, but that the board of capitol managers have no funds at their disposal at the present time to pay the cost of this work, and they have not the power to incur an indebtedness for the same or to pledge the credit of the state, but, however, if the board of public works will have this work done in connection with the other work now being done under the plans, prices and contract for the other work on the avenue, this board will present to the next general assembly, in what shall seem the best manner so to do, a statement that this work was done with the approval of the board of capitol managers, and will recommend and use its best influence to secure the passage of an appropriation by the legislature to cover the cost of this work as aforesaid, and that a copy of this resolution be transmitted to the board of public works.

Referring to the asphalt walks and drives of the grounds, laid in 1896 by The Colorado Paving Company, the wearing surface has become very defective, except that of the drive passing through Lincoln avenue.

September 30, 1897, the contractors proposed to cut out the cracks of a section of the walks between Grant avenue and Sherman avenue, fill them with new asphalt and coat the surface

with a liquid of the same material. The board granted permission, conditioned that the work would be subject to its approval. The experiment was a failure, and the contractors next offered to lay an entire new surface in squares, which the board, upon investigation, however, considered impracticable.

The contractors later removed the wearing surface of parts of the walks near Broadway and laid new material, which has so far proved effective.

Should this work stand the cold weather during the coming winter, the entire surface will be reconstructed in the spring, free of cost to the state, in accordance with the terms of the contractors' guaranty bond.

FURNISHING.

By an act approved April 7, 1893, there was appropriated \$100,000 for the purpose of furnishing the building, out of which amount there remains an unexpended balance of \$307.43.

All offices are now properly furnished, except the vaults in the following departments: Executive, secretary of state, auditor, state engineer, land commissioners, supreme court and court of appeals, which should be equipped with metal fixtures for the safety of records and other valuable documents.

The board has fitted most of these vaults, temporarily, with wooden shelving, etc., as needed, but deems it important now to provide a safer system for the preservation of state papers and to guard against any emergency which may cause irretrievable loss.

During the next two years it will become necessary to refurnish a number of offices with carpets and to replace such as are unfit for further service, nearly all having been in use for four years.

MAINTENANCE.

For the maintenance and support of the capitol building the eleventh general assembly appropriated, out of capitol building fund, \$72,000 for the years 1897 (or that part of 1897 not already provided for) and 1898, and consigned the care and control of the building and grounds to the board.

The expenditure for every item of the appropriation is shown by the secretary's report.

The electric lighting plant furnished by The Mountain Electric Company, at a cost of \$8,700, of which \$6,600 remained due November 30, 1896, has been paid in full from this appropriation.

BIDS.

All labor and material exceeding in amount the sum of \$500 has been advertised and let by contract, copies of which are on file in the office of the board of capitol managers.

SEWER TAX.

As stated on page 27 of the sixth biennial report, the board, in 1897, stipulated with the board of public works to permit the connection of the building with the city sewer upon the payment of \$1,650, covering an area of thirty (30) lots, including all the ground upon which the capitol is situated the question as to whether the capitol grounds or any part was subject to a sewer tax or not to be referred to a court of competent jurisdiction for final determination.

June 27, 1898, the board was notified by the treasurer of Arapahoe county that, by a recent decree of the district court, the assessment in the twentieth street sewer district had been fixed at \$55 per lot of 3.125 square feet, with interest at ten per cent. from March 1, 1892, making the

In an opinion, rendered by the attorney general on this matter, and on file in this office, he decided that, in his judgment, the board should under no circumstances admit a liability as against the state for the payment of any tax or assessment, although it may be under a moral obligation to pay a reasonable amount to the city for the benefits derived from its sewer sys, tem, it being a matter for the board to determine whether or not the amount already paid is a sufficient compensation for

the services rendered. If, in its judgment, the amount paid for the benefits of said sewer system be not sufficient, then the board undoubtedly has the power to make further appropriation out of the capitol building fund, not as payment of a tax, but as a compensation for benefits received under a contract between the state and the city.

Up to date no further action has been agreed upon.

INTEREST ON BONDS.

Paid from Capitol Building Fund.

The amount drawn against the capitol building fund for the payment of coupons representing the first year's interest accruing on the capitol building bonds issued under the act of 1883, by Auditor Schwanbeck and Treasurer Carlisle, amounting to \$13,875, and which was to be restored to the said fund by transfer from the interest fund, as soon as a sufficient amount had been received into the said interest fund from the collection of interest tax, as provided by section 6 of the above act, has not yet been returned to capitol building fund, but remains charged to general building account, thereby increasing the cost of the building in that sum.

During the fiscal years of 1897 and 1898, the board of equalization levied no special tax for the payment of interest on capitol building bonds, as provided by law (Laws of 1883, page 42, section 6; Mills' Annotated Statutes, page 534, section 324), but ordered the levy to be one-half mill for capitol building and interest on bonds.

To meet the full payment of interest due last year, the state treasurer has, during the fiscal year 1898, drawn from capitol building fund \$8,000 without any authority from this board and for which payment no vouchers have consequently been issued. This amount has not been charged to general building, but simply depleted capitol building fund to that extent.

By this action about \$40,000, including interest for the year 1900, will be used for the payment of interest on bonds diverted from the fund created for the completion of the building, thereby deferring the more immediate redemption of warrants.

UNFINISHED WORK.

The following is a list of items to complete the building, in addition to the marble work mentioned:

Steel floor, top floor of dome.

Finishing openings and windows of dome above third floor.

Changing wooden stairs, second to third floor.

Bronze rail, opening of dome, second floor.

Bronze door, main entrances, first floor.

Revising plaster work to conform to marble wainscoting, first floor.

Plaster ceiling to gallery and stairs to dome rotunda, including cornices, basement to first floor.

Galvanized iron to finish beams, basement.

Tiling state library, and room 12, law library.

Bronze statue on dome.

With reference to finishing the interior of the dome, first and second floors, which was to be executed in marble as directed by the last general assembly, but which, for reasons stated, was not commenced, the supervising architect, Mr. F. E. Edbrooke, has prepared a new design, on file in this office, which, upon investigation, the board considers better adapted and more suitable for its architectural effects as well as its artistic designs, and which the board respectfully submits for your consideration and solicits your examination.

The cost of the work is estimated at \$16,396.

CHAPTER 3.

APPROPRIATION-CAPITOL BUILDING.

(S. B. No. 433.)

AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE MAINTENANCE AND SUPPORT OF THE STATE CAPITOL BUILDING AND GROUNDS OF THE STATE OF COLORADO, FOR THE YEARS OF 1897 AND 1898.

Be it Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

Section 1. For the maintenance and support of the State Capitol building and grounds of the State of Colorado, for the furnishing of heat, light, water, telephone service, necessary supplies for State offices, and engineers, firemen, engine and boiler supplies, electric lighting plant, repairs, watchmen, elevator pilots, janitors, janitors' supplies, laborers on grounds, ground supplies, etc., for the years of 1897 and 1898 there is hereby appropriated out of the Capitol Building Fund the sum of sixty-three thousand dollars (\$63,000.00), or so much thereof as may be necessary.

Section 2. The Auditor of State is hereby authorized and directed to issue certificates of indebtedness for all claims duly audited and certified by the Board of Capitol Managers, or its successors, for material furnished and labor performed, where there are no funds in the treasury at the time of the issuance thereof, to meet the same; said certificates of indebtedness to be payable out of the Capitol Building Fund and out of the moneys appropriated for the maintenance of said Capitol building and grounds. The faith and credit of the State of Colorado is hereby pledged for the payment of interest and principle of this indebtedness; and it is further provided, That the said certificates of indebtedness shall be presented to the State Treasurer, who shall thereupon countersign and indorse the same as bearing interest at the rate of six per cent (6%) per annum, payable semi-annually, from the date of presentation to the

date of payment thereof; but in no event shall the certificates be in excess of the appropriations made for the maintenance and support of said State Capitol building and grounds.

CHAPTER 4.

APPROPRIATION-CAPITOL BUILDING.

(S. B. No. 194.)

AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE COMPLETION OF THE STATE CAPITOL BUILDING AND IMPROVEMENT OF GROUNDS OF THE STATE OF COLORADO; PROVIDING FOR THE USE OF COLORADO MARBLE THEREIN AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF CERTIFICATES OF INDEBTEDNESS IN PAYMENT FOR LABOR AND MATERIAL USED IN THE CONSTRUCTION AND COMPLETION THEREOF.

Be it Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

Section 1. There is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the treasury, being funds created by levy or otherwise, for the construction of the State Capitol building, and improvement of grounds, and from such other funds as make part of what is known and styled as the "Capitol Building Fund," and not otherwise appropriated, the sum of one hundred and forty thousand (140,000) dollars; said appropriation being necessary in order to enable the contractor to complete the interior marble decoration, according to the plans and specifications of the Superintendent; and, further, to complete the entire building according to the plans adopted. It is further provided, that out of the total sum of one hundred and forty thousand (140,000.) dollars hereby appropriated, eighty nine thousand and five hundred dollars (\$89,500) shall be used for the purpose of finishing the interior marble decorations, by the conrtactors, according to the plans and designs of the Superintendent of the building; and the balance, fifty thousand and five hundred dollars (\$50,500) shall be used for the completion of the building and improvement of grounds; said building to be completed in as short a time as is consistent with the high character of the work to be performed and the time necessary to manufacture and procure the material in Colorado.

Section 2. The Anditor of State is hereby authorized and directed to issue certificates of indebtedness for all claims duly audited and certified by the board of Capitol Managers for material furnished and labor performed in and about the erection and construction of said building, where there are no funds in the treasury, at the time of the issuance thereof, to meet the same; said certificates of indebtedness to be payable

ont of the Capitol Building Fund and out of the moneys appropriated for the erection and completion of said Capitol building.

The faith and credit of the State of Colorado, is hereby pledged for the payment of interest and principal of this indebtedness; and it is further provided, that the said certificates of indebtedness shall be presented to the State Treasurer, who shall thereupon countersign and endorse the same as bearing interest at the rate of six per cent. (6%) per annum, from the date of presentation to the date of payment thereof; but in no event shall the certificates be in excess of the appropriations made for the construction and completion of said building.

Section 3. On the tenth day of each and every month, if there be funds in the treasury to pay any certificates of indebtedness provided for in the foregoing section, the Treasurer of State is hereby required and directed to give notice by advertisement in a newspaper published in the city of Denver, designating the certificate by number, in order of their presentation to the State Treasurer and endorsed thereon, which the funds in the treasury will pay. At the expiration of thirty days from the date of the last insertion, interest on the certificates so named as being payable shall cease.

Section 4. All aets and parts of aets inconsistent with the provisions hereof are hereby repealed.

Section 5. In the opinion of the General Assembly an emergency exists with regard to the matters provided for in this bill; and, therefore, this Act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 34.

CAPITOL MANAGERS.

AN ACT

(H. B. No. 59.)

TO REPEAL SECTION ONE OF AN ACT ENTITLED "AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE ERECTION AND COMPLETION OF A STATE CAPITOL BUILDING AT THE CITY OF DENVER, AND CREATING A BOARD OF MANAGEMENT AND SUPERVISION," APPROVED APRIL 1, 1889, THE SAME BEING SECTION THREE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-NINE OF MILLS' ANNOTATED STATUTES; AND TO ENACT OTHER PROVISIONS PERTAINING THERETO AND OTHERWISE TO ALTER AND AMEND THE LAST AFORESAID ACT.

Be it Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

Section 1. That Section 1 of an act entitled "An Act to Provide for the Erection and Completion of a State Capitol Building at the City of Denver, and Creating a Board of Management and Supervision," approved April 1, 1889 (the same being Section 329 of Mills' Annotated Statutes), is hereby repealed.

Sec. 2. That there is hereby created a Board of Capitol Managers for the purpose of supervising and directing the construction, completion and furnishing of the State Capitol building for the State of Colorado, and laying out, improving and ornamenting the grounds thereof, at the city of Denver. The said Board shall consist of five members, to-wit. The Governor of the State, John L. Routt, Otto Mears, C. J. Hughes and Job A. Cooper, and the Governor shall be Chairman of the said Board and shall have the power to fill vacancies. Said Board shall continue until the entire completion and furnishing of said Capitol building, and shall announce by proper proclamation the same as accepted by and through the said Board on behalf of the State, and thereafter the. said Board shall cease to exist, except for the purpose of suing or being sued in relation to matters growing out of the subject hereby committed to its charge. The said Board shall be a body corporate, under the name and style of "The Board of Capitol Managers," with the right of suing and being sued, and of having and using a corporate seal, and of altering the same at pleasure. The said Board hereby created shall be the lawful successor to "The Board of Capitol Managers," heretofore established and existing in this State, and the latter Board shall immediately upon the passage of this Act deliver to the Governor for the Board hereby created, all contracts, bonds, deeds, maps, plats, specifications, bids, instruments, memoranda, books, accounts, moneys, correspondence and papers relating to the said Board, or any matters committed to its care or charge, furniture, keys and all property, real, personal or mixed, belonging to the State of Colorado, or now in possession of said Board hereby abolished, or the Secretary or any member thereof, and all lawful contracts and obligations of the said Board shall become the contracts and obligations of the Board hereby created, immediately upon the passage of this Act. The care and control of the Capitol building and grounds shall be with the Board of Capitol Managers.

Sec. 3. A majority of the Board of Capitol Managers hereby ereated, shall constitute a quorum, and be empowered to act in all matters pertaining to the duties of the said Board. No member of the said Board shall be entitled to any salary or compensation, except for actual expenses incurred under the direction of the Board and the same shall be audited and allowed by the said Board before the State Auditor shall be authorized to issue a warrant for the same. The said Board of Capitol Managers shall have authority to appoint a Secretary, and to remove him at pleasure, and to allow him such compensation as they shall deem reasonable and just for the service rendered. The new Board shall also have full power to appoint or employ and discharge at their discretion, a Superintendnet and all other employees whose duties shall be prescribed by the said Board and such other artisans and laborers that may be required in the prosecution of the work of completing and maintaining the building and grounds of said Capitol, and shall allow

such compensation as they shall deem reasonable and just. All salaries and expenses herein provided for shall be paid out of the Capitol Building Fund.

Sec. 4. The said Capitol Board shall have and exercise all the powers and authority, and be subject to all restrictions now provided by law upon the Board of Capitol Commissioners, hereby abolished, save as otherwise herein provided and as in conflict with the provisions of this Act.

Sec. 5. All acts and parts of acts in conflict with this Act are hereby repealed.

Sec. 6. An emergency exists in the opinion of the General Assembly; wherefore, this Act shall be in force from and after its passage.
