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





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REPORT

OF THE

BOARD OF CAPITOL MANAGERS

OF THE

STATE OF COLORADO.

Denver, Colorado, December 1, 1900.

To the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

In accordance with section 7 of an act of the general assembly of the state of Colorado, entitled "An act to provide for the erection and completion of a state capitol building at the city of Denver, and creating a board of management and supervision," the Board of Capitol Managers respectfully presents the following report of its transactions since December 1, 1898, the date of its last report.

Since then the board has mourned the loss of two of its members by death—ex-Governor Job A. Cooper and the Hon. George Tritch. It was during the former's term as chief executive that the act of 1889 was passed changing the material for the construction of the building from sandstone to granite. Governor Cooper became a member of the board during his administration as ex officio chairman, and subsequently served, with the exception of two years, up to the time of his death. On the 4th of July, 1890, during the ceremony of the laying of the corner stone, he delivered the address of the board, and always took a deep interest in the erection and management of the building.

The Hon. George Tritch became a member, succeeding former Governor John L. Routt, June 1, 1897. Although only two years a member of the board, his counsel and advice, as well as close attention to details, made his services of great value to the board and state.

To fill these vacancies in the board, the chairman appointed George W. Baxter and Joseph A. Thatcher, respectively.

Outside of the routine business of the board, the following is a synopsis of the important transactions, grouped under appropriate headings:

Finishing interior of dome, first and second floors.

Changing stairways from wood to iron and marble.

Vitreous tile floors, room 12, law library, and the entire floor space of the state library.

16 circular windows above third story of dome.

10 bronze metal doors to entrances, first floor.

3 marble and metal bulletin boards.

Plans and specifications for the above work, submitted by Architect Edbrooke, having been adopted May 30, 1899, and bids called for after advertising in the four Denver dailies, the Engineering News, New York, and American Contractor, Chicago, the board on July 15 proceeded to open the following proposals:

The decorative marble used in the dome, rotunda, first and second floors, for all wainscoting, is of Colorado marble.

For the panels and shafts of all pilasters, of La Martine.

For the style around the panels and the divisions between and around the styles, the base at the treads of the grand stairways, and wainscoting on the four stairways from the second to third floors, of Brocatello.

. The shelf or nosing at the top of the panel work, the cove under it, and the treads for the four stairways from the second to the third floor, of McMullins' gray Tennessee.

For treads and risers for stairway from basement to second story, of Italian marble.

There are ten pairs of bronze doors for the main entrances of the first floor, the material used being what is known as statuary bronze, oxydized finish, composed of 90 per cent. copper, 7 per cent. tin and 3 per cent. zinc.

The other metal work in dome rotunda is solid aluminum bronze, the same as used for balusters and rails.

The sixteen circular windows for the openings above the third story of the dome are four feet four inches in diameter, and filled with the best stained ornamental leaded glass and painted. Each window has a life-sized portrait of a prominent Colorado pioneer or citizen. The border is six inches wide, with columbine flower wreath upon each side running from the name of each subject at the bottom.

The following portraits appear on the windows: William Gilpin, John Evans, N. P. Hill, Benjamin H. Eaton, Casimero Barela, Bela M. Hughes, William N. Byers, William J. Palmer, James W. Denver, R. G. Buckingham, Alexander Majors, John L. Dyer, Frances Jacobs, Kit Carson, Jim Baker, Ouray.

Three bronze metal and marble bulletin boards in vestibule, first floor, and two bronze bases to newel posts in dome rotunda:

The bid of the latter firm was accepted November 30, 1900.

ARTESIAN WELL.

The board regrets to state that Contractor John C. Swan did not succeed in completing his contract in sinking the well to furnish artesian water for the building, work upon which was commenced in September, 1898, and abandoned in November.

In January, 1899, Messrs. W. R. Adams and Harry W. Lee, of Greeley, the sureties of Mr. Swan, notified the board that they had purchased all the machinery and material from Mr. Swan, and requested that the present location of the well be abandoned and work recommenced in a new place, which was granted. After working for several months it was again discontinued, owing to the fact that a part of a drill becoming lodged in a rocky formation prevented further progress.

The board, believing that further attempts to accomplish the result desired under this contract would result in failure, annulled the contract and perfected a settlement with the sureties, by which all material on hand, consisting of pipe and casing, was turned over to the board, amounting in value at schedule rate to \$490.90, and further reimbursing the board in the sum of \$329.90, the amount advanced on the contract being \$820.80, thereby relieving the state of any pecuniary loss in connection with this contract. In the opinion of the board it is deemed advisable to again proceed with this work, for which the material on hand could all be ntilized.

SMOKELESS FURNACES.

November 17, 1899, the board accepted a proposition from the Doyle Furnace Company to place two of its furnaces on trial for sixty days, with the agreement that if, at the conclusion of the test, they failed to be acceptable, they would be removed and the plant restored to its former condition free of expense. Should the board accept the furnaces, two more were to be provided at a total cost of \$4,000 and a percentage of any saving in fuel for a stipulated time.

After testing, the furnaces proved a success as smoke consumers, but owing to some difficulties presented by the position and construction of the plant, did not show satisfactory results as to economy, and they were removed as agreed.

In order to comply with ordinance No. 28 of the city of Denver, entitled "A bill regulating the emission of smoke from chimneys," the board on June 17, 1900, resolved to advertise for bids on four furnaces, and received the following:

None of the bidders having any of the furnaces represented in this city, except Mr. Wild, the board agreed with the latter to place two of his furnaces on trial for sixty days, and to remove them at the expiration of the term if results were not as guaranteed, no expense to be incurred by the state.

These furnaces have now been accepted, and two more have been placed in the building, the tests proving them to be successful smoke preventers. As to the amount of economy in fuel the board is at present nuable to render an opinion.

ASPHALT PAVING.

With reference to the defective condition of the asphalt walks and drives of the grounds, with the exception of Lincoln avenue from Colfax to Fourteenth avenue, the board, during the last two years, has endeavored to prevail upon the contractor, the Colorado Paving Company, to comply with the terms of its bonds of June 18, 1896, guaranteeing for a period of five years to maintain said work and make all necessary repairs during that time, without additional charge to the state, it being understood and agreed that the guarantee should cover all repairs growing out of certain specified causes and extending to the whole body of the pavement, base as well as wearing surface, even to the total reconstruction of the whole body of the pavement.

• After some slight experimenting by the contractor during 1897 and 1898 on certain parts of the grounds, all of which proved ineffective, the board, June, 1899, nothing further having been done by the company, requested it to carry out the terms of the agreement of 1896.

Receiving no reply, the board, July 14, notified the sureties that, unless the contractor complied with the terms of the guaranty bonds, the board would proceed with the necessary work, charging the cost to the company.

July 26, Mr. F. P. Caughlin, secretary of the company, appeared before the board, stating that the contractor would comply with the demands and make the necessary repairs.

The board contended that the terms of the contract should be complied with without further delay, and that the work should be completed by September 15, which was accepted by the contractor.

At the expiration of that time, however, nothing had been done, and the fall and winter passed.

Early in the spring of 1900 the chairman called the board's attention to the fact that the guaranty bonds of the company for reconstructing or repairing the drives and walks would expire June 18, 1901, and in order to compel said company, as contractor, to carry out the obligation of its bonds, it would become necessary to readjust the grounds, pavement and lawn, in conformity to the present grade, changed by the board of public works in 1898, before paving Colfax avenue, from the grade established in 1895, as per certificate of survey No. 6014, issued by the city of Denver; that this work should not be delayed until too late in the season, for the reason that a number of trees would have to be taken up; that this board has plan and specifications with a proposition from the Denver Paving Company to perform said work at a cost of \$3,929.40, not including the expense of removing the grass and trees from the line of work before excavating and filling could commence, and replacing of the same, which work could be performed by the lawn force without additional expense; that the Twelfth General Assembly had deducted from the amount assessed against the state capitol grounds for the paving of Broadway and Colfax avenue the above amount of \$3,929.40, but had failed to reappropriate said amount, as requested, to provide the board with funds to carry out said work; that according to the secretary's statement, after discharging all obligations due contractors for work let and under construction in the building, there remained an unexpended balance sufficient to pay for said work, and the chairman suggests that immediate action be taken by the board in this matter.

Mr. Canghlin, secretary of the company, being present, stated that the work of readjusting certain parts of the walks and drives could be done at once and completed within thirty days, should the board accept the proposition.

Replying to the question, if the company would, after completing said work, immediately proceed to carry out its obligations of the guaranty bonds, or if it maintained that certain parts of the repairs should not be done again, Mr. Caughlin replied that the original work had not been performed as the contractor had suggested, referring to the thickness of the wearing surface.

Upon examining the specifications it was found that the contract was based on a net thickness of two-inch wearing surface for drives and one inch for walks, after the concrete had received its ultimate compression, which agreement had been accepted by the contractor.

In a letter dated May 11, the contractor stated that the company was ready to proceed with the adjustment of the drives and walks in accordance with its proposition of October 28, 1898.

As to the contractor's proposition in regard to repairing the asphalt surface laid under contract of June 1, 1896, the company claimed that the work was performed exactly in accordance with the specifications, and that the contract had been carried out fully. Referring to the maintenance of said work, the contractor considered the pavements as serviceable and as complete for use as when accepted, and that, as to cracks and defects caused by settling of newly made ground, or other causes beyond the control of the contractor, the latter considered that the company is under no obligations to move and reconstruct said work, as under the specifications and natural conditions of the grounds, any repairs or attempted restoration were considered impracticable.

In the opinion of the company the specifications should be amended and changed to prevent cracks in the wearing surface, in accordance with its protest when signing the contract.

May 18 the board resolved to give the contractor five days' further notice, under the hand of the chairman, to carry ont the provisions of contract and bonds. This notice was entirely ignored by the company, and the work of readjusting the drives and walks has not been performed; neither have any repairs been made.

In order to enforce the terms of the guaranty bonds, which, as stated, expire June 1S, 1901, the board sees no other alternative than to proceed against the contractor by legal process; and summary action should be taken by the legislature to make an appropriation to enable the board to carry out the alterations required by the change in the grades on Lincoln and Sherman avenues.

GRADING AND CURBING ALONG THE FRONTAGE OF CAPITOL GROUNDS.

Relative to certain work on Fourteenth avenue and Grant avenue, along the capitol grounds, required under the contract for the Capitol Hill grading and curbing district No. 1, during 1899, the board, November 24, on the application of the board of public works, adopted the following resolution:

Resolved, That that portion of Fourteenth avenue from Broadway to Grant avenue, and Grant avenue from Fourteenth to Colfax avenue, along the frontage of the capitol grounds, embraced in the Capitol Hill grading and curbing district No. 1, should be graded, and the curbing on the west side of Grant avenue, from Fourteenth avenue to Colfax avenue, reset to conform to the roadway width fixed by ordinance, and that the total cost of curbing and one-half of the grading included in said work should be borne by the state of Colorado; but whereas the Board of Capitol Managers have no funds at their disposal at the present time to pay the cost for this work, and they have not the power to incur an indebtedness for the same or to pledge the credit of the state, but, however, if the board of public works will have this work done in connection with the other work now being done under the plans, prices and contract for the other work on the avenues, this board will present to the next general assembly, in what shall be the best manner so to do, a statement that this work was done with the approval of the Board of Capitol Managers, and will recommend and use its best influence to secure the passage of an appropriation by the legislature to cover the cost of the work as aforesaid, and that a copy of this resolution be transmitted to the board of public works.

In accordance with the foregoing resolution, the board of public works performed the work as stated, and the amount therefor, \$589.54, is justly due the city of Denver, and we urge and recommend that the Thirteenth General Assembly make the required appropriation to pay this indebtedness.

MONUMENT FOR CAPITOL GROUNDS TO BE ERECTED BY THE SONS OF THE REVOLUTION.

July 25, 1899, the Society of the Sons of the Revolution in this state informed the board that they desired to commemorate the valor and patriotism of the Colorado volunteer in the Spanish-American war by the erection of a permanent and enduring monument in granite and bronze, and requested the use of the circle of ground at the west front of the capitol, now occupied by the flag pole erected by the society, as the site for such monument.

At a meeting of the board held July 26 the request was granted and the following resolution adopted:

Be it resolved by the Board of Capitol Managers of Denver, Colorado, That permission is hereby given to the Society of the Sons of the Revolution of the state of Colorado to erect a monument, under the supervision of this board, in the circle of ground in front of the state house now occupied by a flag pole erected by said society; this permission being given upon the condition that said society shall submit to this board for its consideration and approval, a design of such monument as may be accepted by said society, and said board shall have supervision of the work in connection with its erection, and that on the completion of the work the said society shall deliver over to said board, or to such other representatives of the state as shall then have in charge said ground, said monument, so that said ground shall be at all times under the control and in the possession of the state.

CARTER COLLECTION.

At the request of the Colorado Museum and Historical Association, the board, June 11, 1900, permitted the storing of the Carter collection in the south corridor of the basement, the same to remain at the pleasure of the board, provided no damage is done to the building, the passages not obstructed, and all expenses paid by the association. This was granted for the reason that the association was unable to secure any other fire-proof building.

REPAIRS, ETC.

Aside from the ordinary repairs on the steam and electric plants, cansed mostly by wear, the former having been in use for nearly seven years, as well as repairs on elevators, etc., the board was obliged to expend a considerable amount for other contingencies, which had to be promptly met, to prevent greater damage.

Owing to the settling of the arches and walls of the coal tunnel and receiving vault, between Fourteenth avenue and the boiler room, caused by rain and snow, it became necessary to remove and relay the concrete and asphalt surface, in order to enable the workmen to repair the damage. The entire stone walk around the building, having also settled from like causes, had to be taken up, the ground filled in and the flagging relaid. All outside stairs to building and on grounds had to be pointed.

The partition walls between boilers had to be removed and rebuilt with new material, they being weakened by springing of the steel frame work.

MISCELLANEOUS, ETC.

In addition to the work let by contracts, the following improvements were made.

A large space in the sub-basement has been provided with cement floors, partitioned, wired, and shelving erected, for use of the State Historical and Natural History Society

for storing and filing books, pamphlets, newspapers and other collections for which there is no space in the museum on basement floor. Room 12 on said floor was set apart for a herbarium collected in Colorado by Professor-E. Bethel, director of the botanical section of the Natural History Society, to be donated to the state, but which has not yet been utilized for this purpose. In the meantime, the curator is exhibiting casts of prehistoric stone implements, presented by the Smithsonian Institute, and other collections, for which there is no space in the other rooms, set apart for the historical society. ~

The board also supplied this department with 200 bird stands.

A metal canopy was placed above the third floor at the bottom of the lantern above the dome, to close the opening.

An oak partition was placed in the attorney general's office, and counter furnished for land office.

The state library received six book cases and a newspaper cabinet. Board of Charities and Correction, one oak file case. Executive offices, a Globe record case and one oak office table. State board of health, one typewriter table, one unit D. F. file case, one oak file case and shelving for vault. Secretary of state's office, two record and one stamp case; also additional shelving cases and drawers for vault. Horticultural department, a showcase and table. Adjutant general's office, one oak flag case.

Walls and ceilings in law and state libraries, and those of the supreme court room, have been tinted, and in the latter they were also decorated. Auditor's private office has been finished in oil.

New carpets were laid in the following offices: Secretary of state, general office; Judge Bissell, chambers; adjutant general, five office rooms; auditor, private office.

Nearly all the other departments, including the legislative, will require new carpets within the next biennial term.

For use of the grounds thirty-six additional iron settees were purchased.

During the past year no hose for sprinkling has been bought, but for the next season 2,400 feet will be required.

The elm trees along Colfax avenue and Fourteenth aveme are all in a thrifty condition, but borers have made their appearance in the ash trees along Grant avenue and Broadway. The board has taken precautions to prevent the destruction of the ash trees, but would not be surprised if all belonging to that specie would decay, in which event some other kind of shade trees should be planted.

By an explosion in the vault of the horticultural department, caused by gas not being turned off, a number of large windows and door lights were destroyed and the woodwork damaged to the extent of \$137.67. Since this occurrence no gas is permitted to be used in the vaults of any department.

As a precaution against the destruction of records, etc., by fire in vaults, the board purchased and distributed ten fire extinguishers in different offices.

Under the act which requires the board to maintain and support the buildings and grounds, there is a constant demand for fixtures, repairs of furniture, machinery, etc., that the board is compelled to meet.

Owing to the growth of the several exhibits there is an increased demand for showcases and fixtures each year, which should be considered by the general assembly. With the limited appropriation the board has not been able to grant the furniture requisitions for any considerable amount during the last two years.

MARBLE WORK.

In previous reports the board was compelled to call your attention to the unsatisfactory progress of this work, commenced in 1894, but is now able to state that all contracts have been completed and accepted.

The original contract for wainscoting the basement called for the use of Beulah marble. For this was substituted Vermont, for dadoes, with Beulah base and cap, the height reduced from five to four feet, and \$3,500 deducted from contract price. The change in material was made to produce more light, Beulah marble being considered too dark for the location.

Work in niches and sills was also simplified and \$1,970 deducted therefor.

NINTH BIENNIAL REPORT

UNFINISHED WORK, ETC.

Referring to the unfinished work upon the building, as set forth in our last biennial report, we are pleased to state that, with the exception of the dome statuary and metal floor for top story of the dome, all work has been completed.

The placing of the dome statuary has not been undertaken for the reason the board considered the completion of the other parts of greater importance. The practical was given the preference over what is considered the mere final finishings.

The necessity of having models and designs for the statuary, harmonizing in appointment and artistic finish, is a matter of such importance as to demand due care and consideration before beginning active work, as required by the original plans and specifications.

The floor of the sub-basement, with the exception of that portion assigned for the use of the State Historical and Natural History Society and the dynamo room, remains in an unfinished condition. This part should have a cemented floor, to be utilized for exhibit or storage purposes by such departments that may require more space.

The interior walls of halls, corridors and dome rotunda were completed about six years ago with a rough sand finish, as required by the original specifications, preliminary to receiving a fresco finish.

They are now in such a soiled and blackened condition, and it being impossible to clean this kind of surface, they should receive a smooth fresco finish. The plaster work on pilasters, by reason of the readjustment of same to conform to the marble wainscoting, has become stained and also requires a fresco finish.

The interior decorations on the walls have been completed on the lower floors of the senate and house. The remaining portions of the walls and ceilings above the gallery floors should be likewise ornamented. With the exception of the governor's business office, the auditor's private office, and the ladies' reception room, no other offices have received any decorations.

The exterior of the dome from roof line to lantern having become blackened by smoke and the action of the elements, should be repainted. The Wild smokeless furnaces now in place will prevent any discoloration by smoke in the future.

The granite work requires cleaning and a caulking of the joints of all projecting courses.

The cemented floors now occupied by the State Historical and Natural History Society should be changed to a vitreous tiling.

Referring to metallic fixtures, the board has in former reports called attention to the importance of the matter. Although the vaults, as well as the entire building, are fireproof, yet it is dangerous to risk the storage and filing of valuable state documents, such as books, records, accounts, plats, maps, etc., in wooden shelvings, with which all vaults are now temporarily provided. Hence the board again considers it its duty to recommend a safer system for the preservation of state papers, whose destruction would cause irretrievable loss. At the present time almost every public building, be it ever so unpretentious, is supplied with such fixtures, and it appears to the board unwise not to have our state capitol provided with like safeguards.

The electric lighting plant operated since June, 1896, consists of two dynamos of 50 kilowatts, each of a capacity in lights of about 1,000, although this is rarely obtained in actual practice. Now there are about 3,000 lights connected with the plant. These do not all run at the same time, but at certain periods, as during a legislative session, considerable of an overload is brought on the dynamos. Although the machines are built especially strong, it is not advisable to put them to this strain.

The board therefore recommends that another unit of 100 kilowatts, consisting of a multi polar engine type generator, speed 265 revolutions per minute, 125 volts D. C., direct connected to a 16x14 Ball engine, and one switch board with generator and feeder panel, and necessary instruments, be provided, which will relieve all the strain and give ample capacity as long as needed. Such a unit would have a capacity of about 2,000 incandescent lights.

The board is advised that such a unit could be furnished complete, set on foundations, including foundations, ready to connect, for about \$5,000.

To carry out the work as enumerated, namely, cementing floor of sub-basement; providing a vitreous tile floor in natural history department; frescoing walls of halls, corridors and dome rotunda, decorating upper walls of senate chamber and house of representatives; painting exterior of dome from roof line to lantern, placing of a dome statuary; laying of a metal floor, top story of dome; cleaning all granite work and caulking of joints; and additional unit to electric plant, there will be required, according to the architect's estimate, \$48,000.

FUNDING OF OUTSTANDING WARRANTS.

The outstanding warrants at the close of the fiscal year 1900, according to the secretary's report, amount to \$585,-740.07, to which should be added an approximate amount of \$29,287.00 for accumulated interest up to that date, making a total of \$615,027.07.

As is known, the issuance of these warrants or certificates of indebtedness was authorized by the acts of 1893, 1895, 1897 and 1899, in order to provide the board, when necessary, with means to complete the building, and furnish and maintain the same, when there were no funds at the time of the issuance thereof to meet the accounts, said warrants or certificates to be payable out of the capitol building fund, and to bear interest at the rate of six per cent. per annum.

The board now respectfully suggests the funding of these outstanding warrants or certificates, by constitutional amendment, for the following reasons:

1. That the interest so far expended for the redemption of warrants or certificates and the semi-annual interest on maintenance warrants amounts to \$85,689.08, and is accumulating to such an extent that the final payment of the warrants or certificates will be delayed a number of years.

2. That in addition to the interest on warrants or certificates, there should be considered the interest on bonds, which is annually \$22,500.

3. That since 1897 the levy for interest on bonds has been discontinued, and since that time the levy stands onehalf mill for capitol building fund and interest on bonds.

4. That a large amount in interest on warrants or certificates would be annually saved in the difference of the present rate of 6 per cent. and that of 4 per cent., at which the indebtedness should be funded.

5. That the longer the outstanding warrants or certificates remain unpaid, interest will more rapidly accumulate, thereby delaying ultimate payment to the holders of the same, as the interest will absorb a large part of the revenue derived from the one-half mill levy.

6. That by funding the indebtedness at 34 to 4 per cent. the state would be enabled to pay interest on bonds, interest on funded indebtedness, maintenance and support of buildings and grounds, and the amount that may be required for any needed improvements from the revenues of the one-half mill.

7. That after paying all of the above, a reasonable amount would be left for creating an annual sinking fund for the redemption of the indebtedness.

SECRETARY'S REPORT.

To the Board of Capitol Managers:

Gentlemen—I have the honor to present herewith a report of the receipts and disbursements on account of the capitol building for the fiscal years 1899 and 1900, showing the financial transactions from December 1, 1898, to November 30, 1900, inclusive.

All accounts were allowed by the board and certified to the auditor, who drew his warrants on the state treasurer for the amounts stated on each voucher, and in favor of the owner thereof.

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APPENDIX.

CHAPTER 21.

APPROPRIATION—CAPITOL, PART.

(S. B. No. 170, by Senator Seldomridge.)

AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE PAYMENT OF A PART OF THE EXPENSES FOR THE MAINTENANCE AND SUPPORT OF THE CAPITOL BUILDING AND GROUNDS.

Be it Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

Section 1. There is hereby appropriated out of any funds in what is known and styled as the "Capitol Building Fund" and not otherwise appropriated, the sum of thirteen thousand (13,000) dollars to pay a part of the expenses for the maintenance and support of the State Capitol Building and Grounds of the State of Colorado. The certificates of indebtedness, issued in payment thereof, shall bear interest at the rate of six per cent (6 per cent), per annum, payable semi-annually.

Sec. 2. In the opinion of the General Assembly an emergency exists; therefore, this act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Approved February 21, 1899.

CHAPTER 18.

APPROPRIATION-CAPITOL.

(S. B. No. 420, by Senator Maxwell.)

AN ACT

MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE MAINTENANCE AND SUP-PORT OF THE STATE CAPITOL BUILDING AND GROUNDS OF THE STATE OF COLORADO FOR THE YEARS 1899 AND 1900, AND FOR REPLACING OLD FURNITURE AND CARPETS AND SUPPLYING NEW FURNITURE IN THE DIFFERENT DEPART-MENTS OF THE CAPITOL BUILDING WHERE REQUIRED.

Be it Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

Section 1. For the maintenance and support of the State Capitol building and grounds of the State of Colorado, for the furnishing of heat, light, water, telephone service, necessary supplies for Legislature and State offices, engine and boiler supplies, repairs, office expenses, watchmen, engineers, firemen, elevator pilots, janitors, janitor's supplies, laborers on grounds, ground supplies, etc., for the years of 1899 and 1900, there is hereby appropriated out of the Capitol Building Fund the sum of sixty-four thousand three hundred dollars (\$64,300), or so much thereof as may be necessary.

Sec. 2. For the purpose of replacing old furniture and carpets and supplying new furniture where required in the different departments, there is hereby appropriated out of the Capitol Building Fund the sum of five thousand dollars (\$5,000), or so much thereof as may be necessary.

Sec. 3. The Auditor of State is hereby authorized and directed to issue certificates of indebtedness for all claims duly audited and certified by the Board of Capitol Managers for material furnished and labor performed, where there are no funds in the treasury at the time of the issuance thereof, to meet the same, said certificates of indebtedness to be payable out of the Capitol building fund and out of the moneys appropriated for the maintenance and support of said Capitol building and grounds. The faith and credit of the State of Colorado is hereby pledged for the payment of interest and principal of this indebtedness; and it is further provided, that the said certificates of indebtedness shall be presented to the State Treasurer, who shall thereupon countersign and indorse the same as bearing interest at the rate of six per cent. (6 per cent.) per annum, payable semi-annually, from the date of presentation to the date of payment thereof; but in no event shall the certificates be in excess of the appropriations made for the maintenance. Sec. 4. In the opinion of the General Assembly an emergency exists; therefor (therefore) this Act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Approved April 13, 1899.

CHAPTER 19.

APPROPRIATION—CAPITOL GROUNDS.

(S. B. No. 14, by Senator Parks.)

AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE PAYMENT OF THE AS-SESSMENT AGAINST THE STATE CAPITOL GROUNDS FOR PAVING COLFAX AVENUE AND BROADWAY.

Be it Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

Section 1. That the sum of seven thousand five hundred seventy dollars and seventy-five cents is hereby appropriated out of any moneys to the credit of the Capitol Building Fund, not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of paying the said amount assessed against the state capitol grounds for the paving of Broadway and Colfax Avenue; said assessment being divided as follows, to-wit: For Broadway paving district No. 2, three thousand seven hundred eighty-five dollars and thirty-five cents · (\$3,785.35); In Colfax Avenue paving district No. 1, three thousand seven hundred and eighty-five dollars and forty cents (\$3,785.40).

Sec. 2. In the opinion of the General Assembly an emergency exists; therefore, this act shall take effect from and after its passage.

Approved April 27, 1899.

CHAPTER 47.

APPROPRIATION-MARBLE FUND, TRANSFER OF.

(S. B. No. 421, by Senator Maxwell.)

AN ACT

TO AMEND SECTION ONE OF AN ACT APPROVED MARCH 31, 1897, ENTITLED "AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE COMPLETION OF THE STATE CAPITOL BUILDING, AND IM-PROVEMENT OF GROUNDS OF THE STATE OF COLORADO: PROVIDING FOR THE USE OF COLORADO MARBLE THEREIN, AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF CERTIFI-CATES OF INDEBTEDNESS IN PAYMENT FOR LABOR AND MATERIAL USED IN THE CONSTRUCTION AND COMPLETION THEREOF," AND PROVIDING FOR THE TRANSFER OF THE UNAPPROPRIATED BALANCE OF THE CAPITOL BUILDING MARBLE FUND, LESS THE AMOUNTS DUE ON UNFINISHED CONTRACTS THEREUNDER.

Be it Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

Section 1. The sum of forty thousand, two hundred and sixty eight and 13-100 (\$40,268.13) dollars, the same being the balance of the Capitol Building Marble Fund by said section 1 of said Act, approved March 31, 1897, heretofore appropriated, less the amounts due on unfinished contracts for labor and marble furnished in said building, is hereby transferred and appropriated to the Capitol Building Appropriation Fund, for the purpose of completing the State Capitol Building.

Sec. 2. All Acts and parts of Acts inconsistent with the provisions hereof are hereby repealed.

Sec. 3. In the opinion of the General Assembly, an emergency exists with regard to the matters provided for in this Bill, and, therefore, this Act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Approved April 13, 1899.

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
